

ROAD PROJECTS NEAR COMPLETION

A number of county road projects that were started with R. F. C. relief money will be nearly completed by July 1, which is the date set for stopping all R. F. C. road work, according to P. M. Morse, county engineer. Thursday the engineer made a trip of inspection of work on several projects in the southern part of the county. He found that Patrolman Cramer's crew on the Garfield Beach road west of Walker has about completed the road through the Beach property and it will extend as far as a tract of timber which now can be reached. His road eventually will extend over the divide into the Cottage Grove district. On the Garoutte road in district 26, crossing the Mosby creek road with the Row river road the engineer found that Patrolman Joe McCauley has about finished grading and will have the route through to its objective by July 1. Patrolman James Tedford and his crew have grading finished as far as the bridge on the Cedar creek road and this improvement will help materially in that section. Patrolman Harry Castle has a part of the Perkins road off from the Cedar creek road graded.

Sports Classes At U. Are Open For Eugeneans

People of Eugene, whether registered in summer session or not, will be given the opportunity of taking swimming, tennis and handball at the University of Oregon during the summer term which opens Monday, June 19, it was announced today by Dr. John F. Board, dean and director of physical education. Swimming will be taught those who cannot swim or who cannot swim well, while life-saving instruction leading to certificates and examiners' certificates will be given to others. The schedule of classes will be as follows: Children, under 10—Monday and Wednesday and Tuesday and Thursday at 9 a. m. Girls 10 to 16 years—Tuesday and Thursday at 10 a. m. Women—Monday and Wednesday at 10 a. m. and Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 8 p. m. Boys—Tuesday and Thursday at 10 a. m. Men—Tuesday and Thursday at 4 to 6:30. Women and girls will use the pool in Gerlinger hall, while men and boys will be instructed in the pool in the Men's gymnasium. A class for women in tennis will be held Tuesday and Thursday from 6:30 to 7:45, while men will meet for handball from 4:30 to 6 on Tuesday and Thursday. Classes will start Tuesday, June 20. Fees will be \$1 for children, \$2 for girls from 8 to 16; \$3 for women; \$1 for boys and \$2 for men. The fee includes use of suits and towels for women and girls, and towels for men. No other equipment will be needed, it is announced.

Huge Trout Caught In Mountain Lake

CASCADE SUMMIT, June 16.—(Special).—A 25-pound Mackinaw trout was caught in Lake Odell by J. T. McCollum last Sunday. The Mackinaws are large fish weighing as high as 60 pounds and they live near the bottom of the lake. Several have been caught in Lake Odell. Mr. and Mrs. McCollum and a relative also caught six Dolly Vardens, among which were two that weighed 16 and 12 pounds. Wm. Pederson, S. P. section foreman here, has caught a string of fish weighing about 10 to 15 pounds almost each afternoon after returning from work for the past week. BROWNSVILLE, June 16.—(Special).—This town is being overhauled, repainted, improved and in various ways "dolled up" in preparation for the Linn county picnic next week when thousands of visitors are expected. Most of the business houses and the two garages on Main street have been repainted. The bronze drinking fountain which was thrown down by the destructive fire last summer has been set up again at the head of Spalding avenue. It commemorates the pioneer spirit and was presented to the city in honor of the Templeton family by the late Raymond Templeton who lost his life during the war while serving his country as an aviator. At the head of Spalding avenue, also, has been erected a board wall whereon is painted caravan trains wending their slow way across plains, deserts and mountains to Oregon. CARS KILL 18

SALEM, Ore., June 16.—(U.P.).—Eighteen persons were killed, 346 injured in 1,587 Oregon automobile accidents during May, reports the secretary of state's office. That brings this year's total to 80 killed, 1,398 injured. In May, 1932, 13 persons were killed, 402 hurt. For the first five months of last year 87 were killed, 1,726 injured in car accidents.
