NEW MOTOR FUEL TO BE MARKETED

Announcement of a new motor fuel to be marketed by the Gilmore Oil company will be made in about a week, according to word brought to Eugene by D. H. F. MacPherson, northwest division manager for Gilmore. Mr. MacPherson was a visitor here Thursday en route to his home in Seattle after attending sales meetings in San Francisco and Los Angeles.

"The new gasoline is the result of more than two years of laboratory and speedway experiments," MacPherson said. "We have shrouded the details of our new product with all possible secrecy because we didn't want any of our work disclosed until we were thoroughly satisfied that we had something that would instantly meet the approval of all motorists."

An intensive and extensive advertising campaign in newspapers will be used to carry the news into the homes of motorists, according to MacPherson.

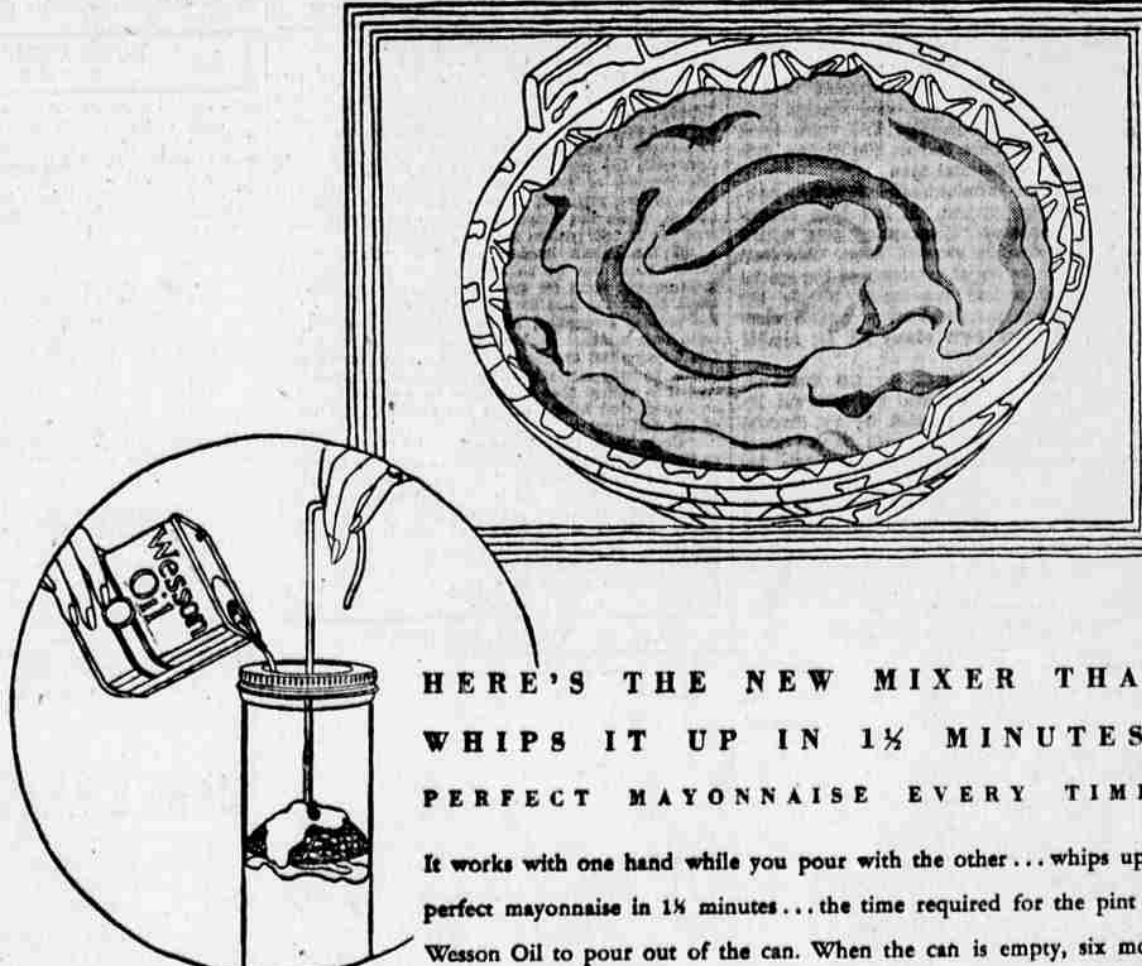
