

M'KENZIE SCHOOL HAS ITS MEETING

WALTERVILLE, June 29.—(Special)—The McKenzie high school annual meeting was held Monday afternoon. Thirty-three votes were cast during the afternoon and about 30 attended the meeting which was presided over by the chairman, L. R. Millican.

The meeting was called for election of one director for five years and D. E. Benson the only nominee received 20 votes to succeed himself.

Transportation of pupils to school and suspension of the high school in this district carried with a vote of 28 for and five against. A vote of thanks was given to Ronald Chase, bus driver, for his care of the pupils on the bus and punctuality and promptness in which the bus route was run during the year.

At the board meeting, which was held after the annual meeting closed, Mrs. O. L. Stacy was elected clerk of the district. The clerk's hire was cut 25 per cent and discussion of other problems held before adjournment.

The Walterville Sunday school district quarterly conference will be held Sunday, July 9, at Woodlawn for an afternoon conference. J. R. Endicott, newly elected president, will preside at the meeting. The contest banner will be awarded for holding the Sunday school which has the highest per cent of attendance, Bible count and lesson study. The banner is awarded each quarter for three months in the school having the highest per cent for the quarter.

The Walterville Union Sunday school will hold its regular annual election of officers next Sunday, July 2.
