with the operations of the recovery act.

Cates said the administration preferred one basic code for the whole lumber industry, with emphasis on a minimum national wage.

Adopting or modifying the tentative code to regional and sub group requirements was the task of the codification committee.

Wilson Compton, manager of the N. L. M. A., is submitting the tentative code, said the recovery act had opened to the lumber industry an opportunity for self regulation and had likewise imposed a corresponding duty of self restraint.

Some of the sections of the act, he said, were "obnoxious, vague and of ominous possibilities." He urged the convention to cooperate with the government.

Objection to the phraseology of a telegram from Secretary of Agriculture Wallace read by Compton was voiced by D. W. Blodgett, president of the N. L. M. A.

"Destructive exploitation" of forests Secretary Wallace referred to, Blodgett said, had not occurred.

Playgrounds Will Open Here July 2

The only playground to be operated by the city this year will open Sunday, July 2, at the Riverview park, it was announced Friday by Gilbert Sprague, playground director this year. The playground and pool will be supervised in the afternoon by competent men, Sprague said.

Flags Displayed In Local Window

A display of 26 flags, showing the development of the American flag of today, is arranged in one of the windows of the Paul D. Green store. The flags were put up by Dr. J. E. Richmond, who is making an extensive study of the subject. Dr. Richmond made and colored each one of the flags in the display.

Flags from the banner of the Vikings, the first on the American continent in 1000 A. D., on down to the present-day flag are displayed. The Spanish flag used by Columbus, the English flag of the Cabot expedition, the Union flag of Great Britain, the Dutch West Indies flag, the Swedish flag, the English red ensign, the East India company flag, and the flag of Peter Rose are among those in the display for the early years of the colonies and America. The French tricolor, Perry's flag, the Chesapeake flag, the Divided flag, the flag of the Confederacy, the Pine Tree flag, the Russian-American company banner, the Mexican flag, the flag of the Alamo, and the flag of Texas as a republic are among other interesting ones in the display. Territorial flags are also shown. A large present-day American flag is spread out at the top and in the background of the display.

New 4-L Pay Scale Effective Saturday

PORTLAND, Ore., June 30.—(U.S.)—All employers and employees affiliated with the Loyal Legion of Loggers and Lumbermen will start operations tomorrow under the new minimum wages code of 32½ cents an hour, approved at the board of director's conference here last week.

W. C. Ruegnitz, president of the Four-L, said the new scale is being put into effect as an interim scale to continue until the lumber industry code, recommending a minimum wage of 42½ cents an hour, has been adopted and included in the federal national industrial recovery act. The code also provides for a basic 36-hour working week.

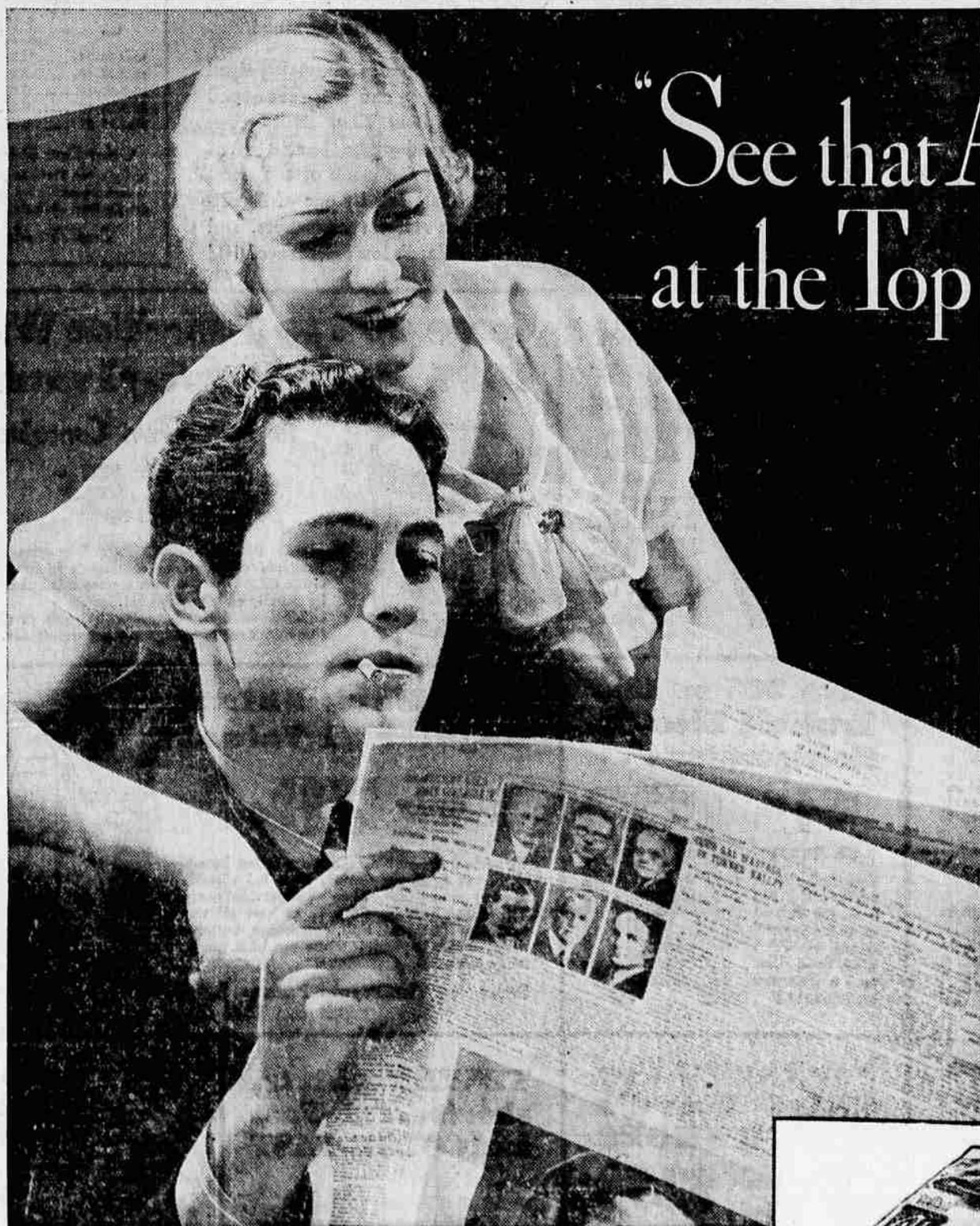
