Head of lettuce (Each one makes up sandwiches to his own taste)
 Fresh Raspberry Tarts, a la mode (tarts topped with ice cream)
 Good Coffee (made on the spot) (don't forget sugar and cream)
 Loganberry Porto
 Clipped ice in thermos bottle
 Watermelon Triangles (don't forget the salt)
 Depression Chicken (Breaded Veal Cutlets)

I am using real steak for my 'depression chicken.' Veal is a nutritious and delicious meat and when properly prepared and rightly seasoned closely resembles poultry in food value, appearance and flavor. Pork steak or domestic rabbit may be used just as successfully.

Three pounds veal steak; 1½ teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon poultry seasoning (but dried celery leaves are the best to use); ¼ teaspoon pepper (scant); 1 cup dried bread crumbs; 5 tablespoons shortening; 2 small eggs; 3 tablespoons water; 1½ cups hot water. Cut each pound of veal steak into 3 or 4 pieces. Wipe with a clean damp cloth, sprinkle with salt, pepper and dried celery leaves. Roll in bread crumbs. Dip in well beaten eggs diluted with water, and roll again in crumbs. Melt shortening in iron frying pan. Put in cutlets and brown nicely on both sides (do not burn). Add hot water a little at a time. Cover closely and let steam until tender, about 45 to 50 minutes. Cook thoroughly. If desired—serve hot in and around a noodle ring.

Egg Noodle Ring
 Two cups cooked noodles; 1 cup diced cheese; 1 cup soft bread crumbs; 1 tablespoon minced parsley; 3 tablespoons minced pimientos; 2 tablespoons shortening; 1 tablespoon minced onion; 1 cup milk; 2 eggs (well beaten); a teaspoon salt; 1-8 teaspoon pepper. Cook noodles in boiling water for 10 minutes—then drain. Combine ingredients in order given. Transfer to a well greased ring mold. Place mold in pan of hot water. Bake in moderately hot oven (375 F) until firm, about 35 minutes. Unmold on a large platter or tray. Serve hot. Ring may be filled with the meat. Serves eight. Looks good and tastes better. (I wouldn't use this combination at a regular home-meal but a picnic will stand a different treatment. The noodle ring is a meat extender—and will make the meat look 'a plenty'. A little thinking and planning beforehand can save a lot of trouble and confusion when the time for 'lunch' comes. Plan and 'pack' your lunch carefully. While enjoying a glorious Fourth

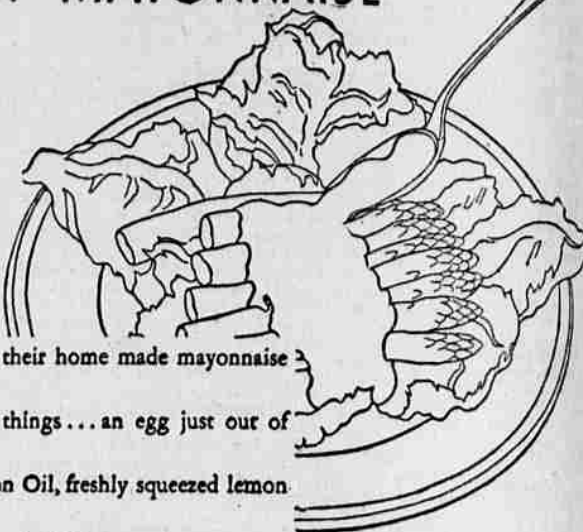
