

Eugene Townies Defeat Salem Senators, 5 To 4

GREEN'S DOUBLE IN TWELFTH WINS FOR LOCAL TEAM

Breaking a twelve-inning deadlock with a series of well-placed hits, the Eugene Townies defeated Salem here Sunday afternoon, 5 to 4.



In one of the season's most thrilling contests, the two teams battled through six scoreless innings after being tied, 4 to 4 in the fifth, and it was Green's double in the twelfth that led to the victory. He was sacrificed to third by Scott and sacrificed home by Bishop, giving Eugene the winning run.

Wiltshire pitched beautiful ball, allowing but nine hits. He did not walk a man in the 12th inning. Bishop also deserves credit for working the batters and catching a fine game, several times tagging base runners.

Eugene started the scoring in the first inning when Wirth and Greene both walked. Scott singled and coupled with Wilson's error and Bishop's single, two runs came in. Bishop then scored on Moore's error.

Salem came back and scored two in the third on Manning's hit and three costly errors by Eugene. Again in the fourth two runs came in on Manning's single, an error and Moore's three-base hit.

Eugene tied the count in the fifth as Wirth led off with a double, went to third on a passed ball and then stole home. Both teams battled on even terms then for seven innings, neither scoring until the last half of the twelfth. Salem threatened in the 11th, as Moore led off with a double, was safe at third on a fielder's choice, when Inman was hit in the face with a thrower ball but Dick Bishop came up with smart playing as he tagged Moore at the plate and then went out and helped Wirth and Dunn run down Keber between second and third, retiring the side.

SHUT-OUT GAME OF 18 INNINGS HUBBELL'S MARK

NEW YORK, July 3.—(AP)—The New York Giants, whose brilliant pitching has been a feature of major league play this season, put on the best mound show in years yesterday, tying one all time record and establishing one season mark, as they blanked St. Louis twice by the identical score, 1 to 0.

Carl Hubbell, of screw ball fame, turned in an "iron man" feat when he pitched the full 18 innings of the opener, registering his fifth shutout and 11th victory of the season.

The 18-inning marathon tied both the modern and old-time major league records for the longest 1 to 0 game. Brooklyn took both nbs of a twin bill from Chicago, 7 to 3, after Al Lopez' homer featured a three-run spurt in the sixth, and 4 to 3, when Lopez stole home in the 9th with the winning tally.

Boston and Cincinnati each blanked the other, the Braves winning the opener, 1 to 0, when Ed Brandt let the Reds down with four hits and Urbanski's double and Berger's single in the third accounted for a run. In the night cap, Larry Benton held his former Boston mates to three scattered hits as the Reds won, 3 to 0.

They were the only National league games slated.

The New York Yankees advanced to within half a game of the leading Washington Senators by beating Cleveland, 7 to 3, while the Senators were idle.

Jimmy Fox drove out four home runs for Philadelphia as the Athletics divided a double-header with St. Louis. He made two in each game, bringing his leading total to 24 for the season. The A's won the opener, 6 to 5, when Dix Williams' fourth straight hit, a single in the 10th, drove in Mickey Cochrane. The Browns took the second contest, 11 to 6, after a five run rally in the eighth.

Rain washed out Washington at Detroit, and Boston's doubleheader at Chicago.
