Wilcox Declares Setup To Mean Closer Check On Aid Funds

RAYMOND D. WILCOX, in charge of federal relief work for Oregon, said Friday that while local family relief agencies will henceforth operate at least temporarily under the jurisdiction of the federal relief agency, the change is merely a technical one to assure proper allocation of federal money for the work.

Change Nation-Wide

The change is to be nationwide. Those now directing the relief for each "family" relief agency will continue in their positions if the agencies, themselves, have approved their work.

Cooperation Is Aim

Under the setup which, Wilcox said, is a technical one that can be made by a simple transfer of letters, the several local and county agencies will act in full cooperation with the federal department and with the full approval and knowledge of the latter organization.

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WIRE FROM FLIER GIVES FIRST WORD

Telegram Gives Location In Village Near Behring Sea

INFORMATION SCANT

Rescue Plane To Make Attempt To Get To Anadir

MOSCOW, July 7.—(AP)—James Mattern, American flier, is safe at Anadir in the Chukotka peninsula of Siberia, according to a telegram message received here direct from Mattern himself.

Mattern's telegram said:

"Safe at Anadir, Chukotka, Siberia, Jimmie Mattern."

The message was sent from the town of Bocharova at 11 p. m., July 5 and was received here in mid-afternoon today.

No Details Given

The American flier's message gave no details of his situation and air force and official quarters here were without any information of him.

Region Sparsely Settled

The fact that so much time elapsed between his descent and dispatch of the message was a factor in the rescue attempt.
