sweetbreads (pull off easily). Drop Sweetbreads into boiling salted water and boil until tender (15 to 20 minutes). Drain, break into fair sized pieces and add to white sauce that has been well cooked. This can be served at once or kept hot over water for an hour or so. Serve in patty shells made of plain pie crust. I like this recipe because the patty shells can be made the day before and the sweetbreads can be made before guests arrive and be kept hot. I quite often use this for Sunday night supper in place of creamed chicken for it is more unusual and can be done in advance just as easily as chicken. I serve it with a large vegetable salad on a large dinner plate. The filled patty shell is placed on the dinner plate besides salad just before serving. — Grace K. Robertson, 849

**Spiced Cold Meat**  
1 large flank steak or two smaller ones.  
1 lb. lean pork.  
1 teaspoon salt.  
1/4 teaspoon pepper.  
1/4 teaspoon allspice.  
If two flanks are used sew together and lay out flat, spread on it the pork, cut into small cubes and seasoned, the onion, (chopped) and roll into a sausage shape. Sew securely and place in a mild brine over night. Boil till tender and when done place in a press till cold. Cut into thin slices and serve cold. By adding vegetables to the broth in which it is boiled a good soup is obtained. A clove of garlic added to the broth while the meat is boiling is an improvement also. — Mrs. W. C.
