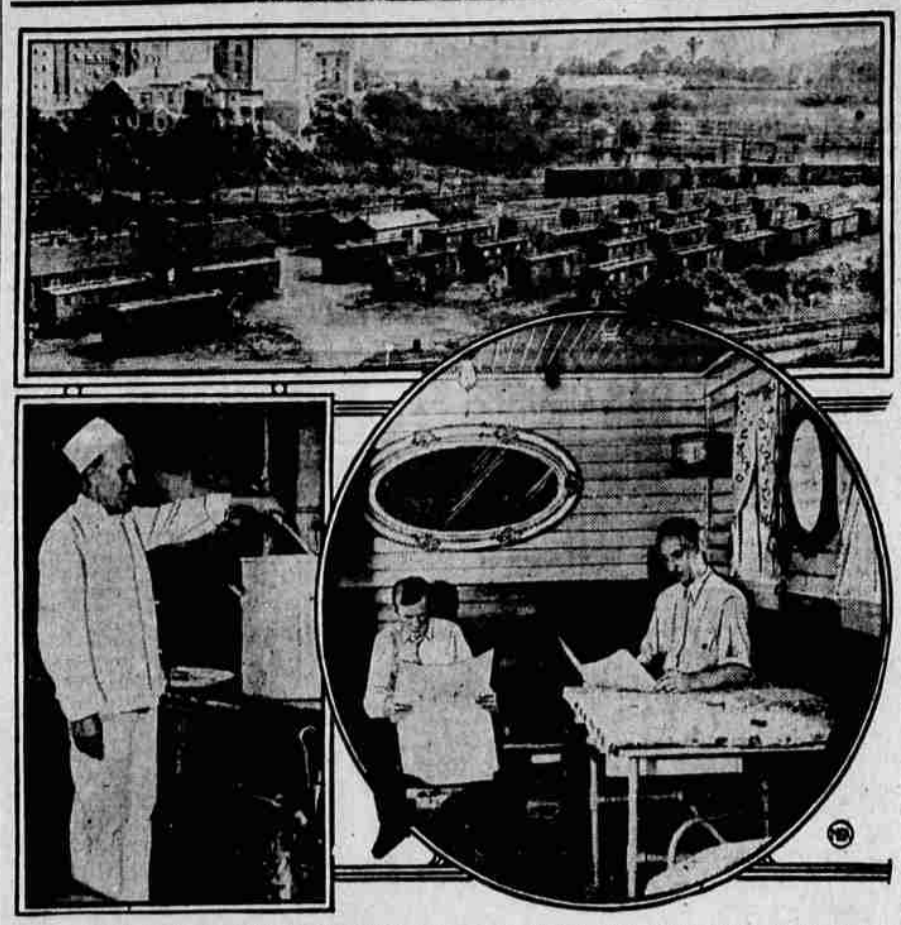


MORE QUESTIONS ARE ANSWERED BY NRA DRIVE CHIEFS
