It was explained that Machado might have stopped at Andros, a little island in the group. There will be no wireless communication with Andros until tomorrow morning.

GOLD SHIPMENT RULES RELAXED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12.—(AP)—A relaxation of the stringent provisions of President Roosevelt's ban on gold exports was announced today by the treasury department to allow American mining interests to ship abroad certain types of the unrefined metals.

Miners have sought permission to sell the gold in the world market, where the price is around \$30 an ounce as compared with the fixed price of \$20.67 an ounce at the United States mint.

If advantage could be taken of this world market, miners declared, the earnings of unemployed men panning gold under grubstake plans would be greatly increased, and many mines now shut down could be reopened and operated profitably.

Under the new regulations announced today, however, grubstake miners and those dealing in pure gold would not benefit, since the only exports permitted by the revised rules would have to be in the form of unreported amalgam, cyanide precipitates, concentrates, and unmeted ore.
