Furthermore, in working out a way of beating the depression it is quite likely that policies will be laid down which will affect the life of the nation for many years after the depression has passed.

All in all, it is an almost overwhelming task. That the work so far has been done so well is a good testimonial to the calibre of the men who are on the job.

WASHINGTON LETTER

(By RODNEY DUTCHER) WASHINGTON, Aug. 26.—President Green of the A. F. of L. didn't like being high-batted by the steel barons who refused to sit with him at Secretary Perkins' conference.

But an experience the same day at the Labor Advisory Board's meeting pained him even still more. At one point he even threatened to resign from the board.

The board has been secretly fighting out a bitter row between A. F. of L.'s United Garment Workers and Board Member Sidney Hillman's larger, more powerful Amalgamated Clothing Workers.

Hillman excoriated Green, producing a letter which Hillman said put the A. F. of L. chief in the position of handing factory owners propaganda against Amalgamated.

The board, willing enough to disapprove the steel men's treatment of Green, exhibited a majority sentiment against his clothing strike attitude.

North Carolina heard that Senator Reynolds was going along and he was scared out by cries of "junketeer."

Then some uninvited committeemen saw the Tydings letter. The maddest one was Robinson of Indiana.

WHAT OTHER EDITORS THINK CLINE FALLS (Bend Bulletin)

A NUMBER of Deschutes county townsites, which for years have existed only on paper, are on their way to oblivion, as a result of action recently taken by the county court, calling for vacation.

Imperial, Cline Falls, Harper and Pringle Falls, places which cannot even be referred to as "ghost towns" will soon be in the same category as the villages of ancient tribesmen built on the shores of Central Oregon lakes now long since vanished.

Quickly, the new townsite passed beyond the map stage and became a community that threatened to push into oblivion another little village of the upper Deschutes, Bend. Late in 1904, business houses were established.

For instance, there was the R. M. Bishop feed stable, the F. W. Hanna general store, the F. M. Donaldson meat market, the J. W. Brown hotel, the Thomas H. Rayburn hotel and the Louis McAllister commission house.

A petition for a postoffice at Cline Falls was favorably considered and in November, 1904, the town was placed on the postal map of the United States.

One thing was lacking—transportation. But the residents of the little town were not discouraged. There were rumors of an extension of a railroad south from Shaniko. And other rumors told of a rail line that was to cross the Santiam and lead directly for Cline Falls.

Finally, a modern highway, the McKenzie, skirted the Cline Falls townsite. But the little village was no longer interested in growing into the Spokane of Central Oregon.

It was content to remain a community one which will remain on the Deschutes country ever after all uninhabited townsites are officially vacated.
