SUGAR PRICE TO ADVANCE FRIDAY

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 21.—(Special)—Advances of one-half to one cent a pound were announced today in cube butter prices.

There was a generally steady tone in the market for eggs during the day; no change in prices being noted in fresh goods although here and there some recessions are noted in storage.

Advance of 10c per hundred pounds was announced today in the refinery and resale price on sugar.

Rather slow trading tone is showing in the market for peaches with prices steady to perhaps a fraction lower when efforts are made to force movement.

While primary points suggested a slight decrease of easiness in potatoes, locally there remains a fairly active tone and practically no change in values.
