

DEMAND FAVORING LOW GRADE WOOL

BOSTON, April 6.—(AP)—The Commercial Bulletin of Boston will say: Business on Summer street this week has been exceedingly slow. Demand has favored the low grade wools and waxes, where prices have been effected at all. Prices have barely steady.

Prices in the country have ruled somewhat lower, especially in the low grade sections. The sale of the 300,000 pounds of clippings in the low grade section, which were brought 15 to 24 to 18 cents, are wools as described as lighter shrinkage than usual, which accounts for a higher price range than would normally occur. The manufacturing outlook is very sure at the moment. Manufacturers are watching developments carefully.

JESSE BEMIS IS KILLED IN WOODS

COTTAGE GROVE, April 6.—(Special).—Jesse W. Bemis, well-known farmer of the London district south of Cottage Grove, was killed at 2 p. m. Thursday while engaged in logging between London and Black Butte. He was driving a team pulling a log when a falling limb of a tree fell and struck him across the chest, killing him instantly.

Mr. Bemis was 40 years of age, having been born at Wapapa, Wis., June 8, 1893. He had been a resident of Lane county about 50 years. He is survived by his widow and eight children as follows: Mrs. Deltha Geer of London, Mrs. Walsh of Santa Rosa, Cal., Mrs. Myrtle Frame of Rainier, Mrs. Jesse Collier of Chinook, Wash., Russell, Jesse, Ollie and Malcolm Bemis, all of London.

The funeral services will be held at the Bemis cemetery Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. I. G. Shaw, pastor of the Christian church of Cottage Grove, will officiate and the Mills chapel will have charge.
