House Race Feature
The republican legislative race attracted the most interest in Lane county with two complete tickets in the field and one lone prohibitionist, F. C. Heffron. Backed by the Lane County Legislative association, the ticket of Senator H. C. Wheeler and E. A. McCornack, unopposed for the senate, and Hill-Huntington-Merriam for the lower house, was victorious over the Veterans Voters' League ticket composed of James K. King, Emmette Howard and Kenneth Nielsen.

In many precincts, the tickets were voted straight while in others the tickets were butchered, voters picking three candidates at large. A analysis of the Eugene vote revealed the legislative ticket, carried in ten of Eugene's 15 precincts, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 16, 17 and 18.

Huntington High
Why Huntington polled the largest vote in the republican legislative race in Eugene, scoring 1,456 in the city. Howard B. Merriam, making his first political race, was second with 1,387, while Earl Hill was third with 1,371. James K. King was fourth with 1,017; Kenneth Nielsen, 888; Emmett Howard, 715; and Heffron, 693.

Shelton Leads Here
In the democratic gubernatorial contest in Lane county, General Martin was handily from young Willie Mahoney, 2,194 to 1,410. General Martin carried all the Eugene precincts save number 1 in which Mahoney was victor, 45 to 33 votes.

Joseph Shelton won a close race with Horace E. Walter, of Corvallis, in the democratic race for secretary of state, the Eugene man winning 1,425 to 1,385 in the 95 precincts completed Saturday night.

In this judicial district, Lane county voters favored James T. Brand, 7,088; Judge Skipworth, 8,655; and B. L. Eddy, 4,988. The same three won in Coos and Curry counties and in Lincoln county, also in this district.

The sales tax won many more friends than at the last election in this county, the total vote being 6,954 to 4,021 vote. In Eugene, eight precincts voted favorably on the much-discussed measure, 6, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18.

intendant at Dallas, was given the democratic nomination.

Democratic Vote Heavier
In the second district, in which con- gressman Walter M. Pierce was un- opposed for the democratic nomina- tion, State Senator Jay H. Upton of Bend took the republican nomination easily.

In the third (Portland-Multnomah county) district, Walter B. Gleason, former democratic nominee for United States senator, won the con- gressional nomination, while Circuit Judge W. A. Ekwall led a large field of candidates for the republican nom- ination.

The democratic party polled about 75,000 votes for the governorship, while the republican voters cast more

than 130,000 ballots. The total elec- toral registration, however, was 160,504, compared with 253,500 in the republicans.

Walter's Margin Big
The republican nomination for secretary of state went to Earl Hill of Arlington by almost a two to one vote over Colonel Carl Abrams of Salem. Snell's campaign was a vic- tory to the people.

The democratic nomination for secretary of state went to Horace E. Walter of Corvallis. Walter, who declared business must replace polit- ics on the state board of control, led a substantial lead over Everett Kan- gan of Multnomah county who was running second, and Joseph E. Hal- ton of Multnomah county in third place.

John L. Rand of Baker county pulled ahead with a strong margin, succeeded himself as an supreme jus- tice on the non-partisan ballot.
