and Alaska cannery ships will not be permitted to load for the far north. Frank M. Warren of the Warren Packing company said it is a certainty that the steamer North King, due here to take supplies and 55 men to Bristol Bay, will not go north from Portland this year.

BENNETT OFFERS PLAN

PORTLAND, Ore., May 31.—(AP)—A resolution which would authorize the Portland dock commission to function as a stevedoring concern and negotiate directly with the striking longshoremen here, was introduced at today's city council meeting by Commissioner J. E. Bennett.

Bennett declared that in negotiations to settle the waterfront strike, the stevedoring companies "are the flies in the ointment."

The city council tabled the resolution for consideration later in the day. Bennett's proposal would instruct the city attorney to draft necessary ordinances to authorize the city dock commission to operate as a stevedoring company only with relation to municipal docks.

Explaining that there are three factors in the strike—the ship owners, the longshoremen and the stevedoring companies, Bennett blamed the latter group and declared the city must protect its interests in municipal terminals. The dock commission, under terms of his proposal, would be authorized to negotiate directly with the longshoremen's union to arrange for loading and unloading ships at municipal docks.

COST IS HEAVY

PORTLAND, Ore., May 31.—(AP)—A complete blockade of the port, caused by the longshoremen's strike, reduced Portland's foreign exports in May to about one-fourth of April's volume. The strike has been in force three weeks.

In May exports abroad amounted to \$2,870 tons valued at \$666,784. In

At the Merchants' exchange it was said that had it not been for the strike foreign exports probably would have been 400 per cent or more greater than in May, 1933. Although the port has been blocked since May 9, exports abroad were about \$140,000 greater in value than in the whole of May last year.

In the month ending today 57 vessels sailed from Portland, compared with 146 in April. Of the 57 which sailed some went without loading all or part of cargo booked for them. It was estimated that 115 vessels have passed Portland by since the strike started.

SAN FRANCISCO TENSE

SAN FRANCISCO, May 31.—(AP)—San Francisco's waterfront battle-ground, along which police charged men and women rioters for the second time in a week, remained tense today as striking Pacific coast longshoremen evaded a surging wave of opposition to an employers' peace proposal.

Shrieks, groans and curses mingled with the sound of running feet as the forces of the law and order broke up a demonstration which authorities declared was led by "girl communists."

When the din of conflict died down along the Embarcadero and other waterfront streets yesterday, 24 persons, including two policemen, received hospital treatment for injuries. Scores of others were knocked down in the rush and battered and bruised.

Indications of the opposition to the employers' proposal, which would grant union recognition and joint operation of hiring halls at all ports, came from Joseph P. Ryan, president of the International Longshoremen's association, and John C. Bjorklund, Pacific district secretary.

Ryan said at Seattle he saw no hope for acceptance of the proposal and had withdrawn his support of it after investigating methods used by shippers at Pacific Northwest ports in hiring non-union workers.

Sheep Chased By Dog Takes Refuge In Owner's Kitchen

A crippled sheep, chased by an Alreado dog, Wednesday took refuge in the kitchen at the home of Chester Conger, who lives a short distance west of the city on the Crow road, according to W. L. Wheeler, county dog control officer.

This dog killed one sheep in the flock of Mr. Conger and the second one it attacked and maimed ran straight for the house and plunged through the screen of the kitchen door, evidently reasoning that it would be safe there from further attack.

Mr. Conger recognized the dog and when the dog control officer arrived he was told where to find it. The animal went the route of all sheep killing dogs, Wheeler reported.

N. E. Beam of Goshen reported to Wheeler Thursday that dogs killed two of his sheep one night this week. He heard them barking and went into the field but was unable to find them.

Tax Compromise Denied By Court

A petition to cancel 50 per cent of the delinquent taxes on the personal property owned by the estate of the partnership of Bressler and son at Cottage Grove was denied Thursday by the county court.

Man to Face Charge Of Killing Pet Deer

Fred Harris of McKenzie Bridge, accused of shooting a pet deer belonging to a resident of that place, telephoned to Justice of the Peace Dan Johnston Thursday that he would be down Friday morning to appear in court. Harris is alleged to have shot the deer, a female, and it was so badly wounded it had to be killed.

Ernest E. Johnson was fined \$5 by Justice Johnston Thursday on a charge of switching license plates from one car to another.

Ruling On Cafe Dancing Is Made

SALEM, May 31.—(AP)—Restaurants permitting patrons to dance without charge, as an inducement to increase sales of food and beverages, are not exempt from payment of a dance hall license, Attorney General L. H. Van Winkle held here today.

The opinion held that dancing was not incidental to a restaurant business, and that a proprietor must take out a license before he can legally permit dancing. The opinion was requested by M. B. Strayer, district attorney of Baker county.
