

RIGGS EXPLAINS HOW TO SIGN UP IN SWIM CLASSES

Directions on registration for the "Learn to Swim" campaign were given out Thursday by Frank Riggs, Red Cross life saving chairman for the county. The campaign is from June 11 to 16.

Registration blanks are being printed in the Register-Guard Thursday morning. One of these is to be filled out and sent to the Red Cross life saving chairman for the county. The campaign is from June 11 to 16.

On Monday, June 11, persons wishing to take the swimming lessons are to report to the instructors at the University pools. The schedule of classes appeared in the Register-Guard Wednesday.

Girls and women are to pay 10 cents each class time for a towel and suit. The University provides suits and towels, and no one is allowed to wear her own suit. The women's pool is in the west end of the building on University and Fifteenth streets. Those in the men and boys' classes will be charged 5 cents per swim for the use of a towel. No suits are worn in the men's pool. The University towels will serve as admittance tickets to the pool room for instruction. The men's pool is located on the ground floor of the gym, corner of Thirteenth and University streets.

In addition to Mr. Riggs, Jean Eberhart and Milo Marlett will be instructors for the classes. Both have had wide experience in teaching swimming and life saving.

The campaign has received the hearty endorsement of Mayor Large, who issued the following statement Wednesday:

"The loss of life through accidental drowning does more to break down the morale of a community than almost any other type of accident. It is, nine cases out of ten, an evidence of that community's failure to protect its swimming places and to teach its citizens the fundamentals of water safety."

"If the swimming and life saving campaign that our Red Cross chapter is conducting should be instrumental in preventing the loss of a single life, it would more than justify its existence."

"But such a campaign has other values. It affords opportunities second to none for the development of the type of citizens every community needs most. Swimming promotes health, cleanliness, self-reliance, and quick thinking. It furnishes a sane and wholesome use of leisure time. Through life saving instruction, fine character traits of unselfish service to our fellowmen are encouraged."

"Finally, but by no means least, swimming is fun; healthy, exhilarating fun that old and young can enjoy."

"I should like to see this campaign as successful that it may continue as an annual event. Those who take part can be assured not only of a great deal of personal pleasure but the further satisfaction of knowing that through their enjoyment they are benefiting both themselves and society."

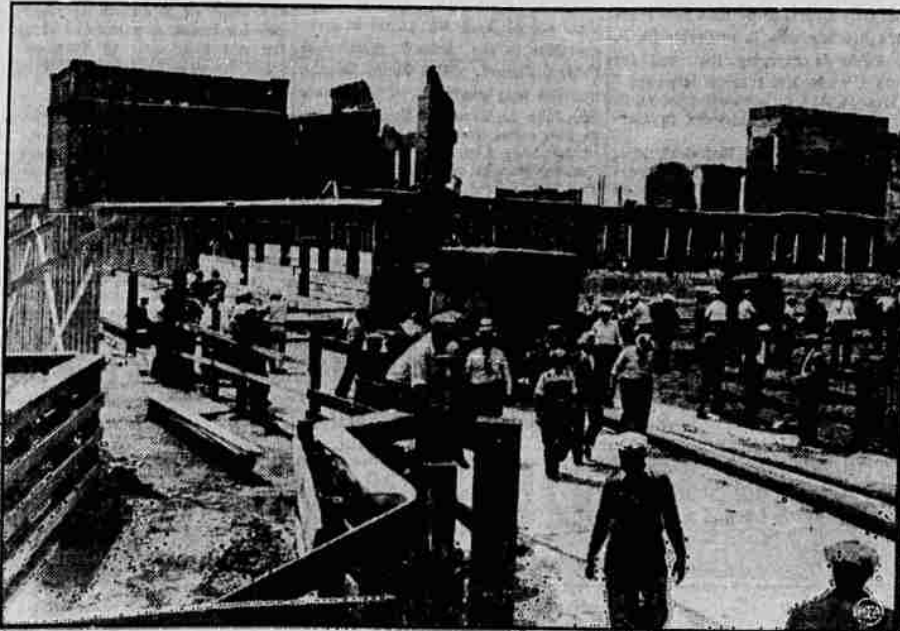

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WARREN D. SMITH SPIKES STORY OF WINBERRY CLAIM

An emphatic denial is the answer of Prof. Warren D. Smith, University of Oregon, geologist, to rumors that he is personally interested in mining claims in the Winberry district. Dr. Smith calls attention to previous reports on this area in which he emphasized the improbability of that field. His letter follows:

To the Editor:—It has come to my attention that certain individuals are making statements that I have located mining claims in the Winberry district. I wish through the columns of your paper to state that I have never located a mining claim in Oregon, and that the Winberry district would be about the last place I would locate one in if I were going out to do so. I am not asserting that there is no value in the district, but I have no reason at present to lead me to look upon this as a place in which I personally would be interested.

After a visit that I made to that district over a year ago, two or three of my students, who got somewhat excited over the situation, located claims just as a "gamble." I do not even know definitely where their claims are, and the students received no encouragement from me in making their locations.

I would suggest to the interested public looking for places in which to invest money in mining ventures to confine their attention to districts like Bohemia, Grants Pass and Baker, where there are well defined quartz veins in which there is a reasonable chance, with proper work, that producing mines may be developed.

As long as I am in the state employ, even though permitted to make investments of this kind, I shall avoid taking financial interest in such activities. This is the only way in which I can maintain a disinterested and unprejudiced attitude and be of the greatest service to the industry.

Any persons especially interested in knowing my particular opinion about the Winberry district may obtain from your files or from my own a copy of a report which I made over a year ago. At that time, I placed a copy of this report with you in anticipation of such unwarranted statements as these I have had called recently to my attention.
