

New York Eggs Higher; Stocks Resume Advance

BUYING PRICES UP CENT ON 3 GRADES SATURDAY MORNING

Buying prices on New York eggs went up a cent Saturday morning. This is the first change these grades have made in several weeks. The prices are: extras, 19 cents a dozen, firsts, 15 cents, and seconds, 12 cents. Mediums were unchanged at 15 cents.

First plans of the year were on the market Saturday. They were grown by Austin Dodds, Twenty-second and Friendly streets in Eugene. The buying price is three cents a pound.

There still are plenty of raspberries on the market to supply all the canning demands of local housewives, dealers report. Although a slight tapering off of the supply is anticipated next week, it is not expected to be under the demand.

CLOSING FACTORS

NEW YORK, June 16.—(P)—

With the threatened steel strike off, at least for the moment, and the national lawmakers about to quit for the summer, stocks resumed their advance in today's brief market. While trading was relatively dull, numerous gains of fractions to around 2 points were recorded. The close was firm. Transactions approximated 600,000 shares.

The declaration of temporary peace in the important steel industry had been fairly well discounted, but brokerage houses reported that sentiment for equities, as a whole, was noticeably improved.

The financial district was cheered by the house approval of the substitute Wagner bill containing the administration's proposal for dealing with labor disputes.

The German debt moratorium seemingly failed to make a material impact, although some international bankers felt that the final word in this situation has yet to be said.

BUTTER DEMAND EXCEEDS SUPPLY

PORTLAND, June 16.—(P)—There is a far greater demand for butter from speculative interests than current supply, therefore undertone of the market was very firm irrespective of what happens in the exchange.

Demand for butter has increased while the supply has decreased. The trade has been much speculative although fresh consumption volume has been rather surprising to distributors.

Butterfat values were steady to firm and generally unchanged in this territory.

Trading in the egg market continued of fully steady character here. There was no change in the price on the open market for the weekend. Receipts continued to decrease.

Slow trading tone was suggested all through the market for live chickens with big killers able to take full advantage of the situation by filling their ice houses with lowest priced stuff for years.

Much better demand was suggested all through the market for berries. Extreme shortage of strawberries forced values sharply higher for the week-end but all berries were in greatly improved call.

Market for celery was firm with a country call for Oregon supplies. Prices were slightly higher in spots here with Portland distributors unable to fill all orders.

Home grown potatoes are now so good and in such liberal offering they were taking far the bulk of the local demand. Prices were practically unchanged.

Cheese market retained a strong position with continued liberal speculative demand. Prices were firmly held here. Consumptive call was seasonably liberal.

NEW SPUDS, BEANS LOWER AT MARKET

Public market new potatoes and new wax beans were lower Saturday. New spuds are now selling at 2 cents a pound, a cut of half a cent, while beans are three pounds for 25 cents instead of two pounds for that amount.

Second crop new peas are now priced at three pounds for 25 cents. Old crop is four pounds for the same price.

Many stalls are showing the popular little Zucchini or Italian squashes. These are a comparative newcomer to the vegetable realm in the west, and are quite in demand already, growers report.

First of the yellow crooked-neck squashes were at the market Saturday morning at stall 15. The price is 8 cents a pound or two pounds for 15 cents.
