

## COUNCIL ADOPTS PLAN TO IMPROVE DRIVE UP BUTTE

AUTHORIZED widening of Skinner butte road.  
APPROVED purchase of \$21,500 sinking fund bonds.  
AUTHORIZED Pageant association to put up street decorations.  
AUTHORIZED concessions in park blocks, closing North and South Park streets.  
DECIDED to ask highway commission to re-surface West Sixth avenue.  
ACCEPTED small bird bath presented by Burt Brown Barker.

A proposal to increase the width of the road around the top of Skinner butte four feet on the north side was approved by the city council at its regular Monday night meeting of the group. The request for the additional width to the road came from the city park commission in the form of a recommendation.

It was decided to use transients at the transient relief camp for labor on the project and the city will furnish rock for the construction.

The park commission pointed out that this road was extremely narrow and that an additional four feet would make it much safer.

The council approved the purchase of \$21,500 in bonds for the sinking fund for debt retirement. City fathers also approved payment of monthly bills.

Upon recommendation of the parent committee of the city council, the group authorized the pageant association to string banners and other street decorations along city streets for the pageant. These decorations will be given to the city following the pageant and may be used for decoration in future events. Council also authorized the closure of North and South Park streets for the concessions in the city park, but decided to keep Eighth avenue open.

Mayor Elissa Large, City Engineer W. Chubb, and Fred Lamb, of the street committee, were named a committee to request of the state highway commission the re-surfacing of West Sixth avenue.

Seven more applications for rebonding delinquent tax assessments were received, bringing the total applied for to date to \$83,637.97.

A sandstone bird bath, sculptured by Jean Sutherland, of the university, was presented to the city by Burt Brown Barker, vice-president of the university. This project was done under the federal funds given for artistic creation and is designed for use as a model for a larger piece. It is 18 inches in height.

A request from Seymour's cafe to extend an electric sign over the sidewalk was referred to the fire and water committee. The council authorized the sale of a lot between Eighteenth and Nineteenth on Mill to Herman Knudsen for \$308.23.

Several complaints on smokestacks in the city were received by the council and were referred to the building inspector for investigation.

We slipped a bit yesterday when we told you Irene Dunn was a society belle in "Stingaree." We had our pictures mixed, or something. Irene is a servant girl, with a marvelous voice (it really is, too), and the great Australian bandit, Stingaree, falls in love with her. Richard Dix as Stingaree gives his freedom that she may have a chance in opera, and in the end she returns to sing to him. Effectively staged, with splendid acting and the best music since "Be Mine Tonight."

The State's double bill is worth seeing. "Witching Hour" is an unusually entertaining picture, dealing with the weird subject of hypnotism, and the actions of an individual while under a hypnotic spell. John Halliday superb as the hypnotist, while Judith Allen and Tom Brown play their roles capably. Sir Guy Standing fine, too. "Now I'll Tell" by Mrs. Arnold Rothstein is an expose of what purports to be the true story of the Wall Street gambler. Well acted by Spencer Tracy, and starring gorgeous Alice Faye.

Two of the best acted, most entertaining pictures of the month are on the McDonald screen. First is "Little Miss Marker," starring cute Shirley Temple, and second in "The Return of the Terror," a mystery picture that really baffles. "Little Miss Marker" is a Damon Runyon story, faithfully transcribed to the screen, and it's plenty good. "The Terror" employs the old standby of the thunder and lightning storm, but has so many new angles that it deserves recommendation.
