STRIKE WILL HAVE EFFECT ON BUTTER

PORTLAND, July 14.—(AP)—Butter and egg prices were unchanged today.

The butter market here, like that of many other commodities, is due to be affected by the strike situation. Dealers reported that the movement into California from the northwest has been checked by the truck drivers' strike in the south and these supplies are now held here. Strike news of today will have a pronounced effect on the local market probably. Many householders have already started putting in heavy supplies of various commodities in advance of a general strike threat. This development became apparent Friday. It is therefore not improbable that there will be a heavy
