

COOL RAINS BRING TEMPERATURE DROP

Scorching heat has been routed after killing 1988 persons.

Cool breezes swept rains into most sections yesterday, but while they brought a sharp drop in heat fatalities, they afforded no material aid to the drought ravaged farm areas.

Temperatures broke 43 degrees in some sections, but in the Pacific southwest, where a new heat wave started, thermometers rocketed to 110 degrees. Readings were high, too, along most sections of the Atlantic coast.

The heat wave took its great toll in Missouri where 378 perished. Illinois and Ohio were next with 362 and 163, respectively.

In Missouri the relief was less marked than in some other sections. Kansas City's temperature dropped from a previous maximum 110 to a 94 high yesterday and St. Louis had 90 degree drop in maximum temperature from its previous high of 110.

400 rains added to the relief last night.

Business Good in Spite Of Drought, Heat And Strikes

NEW YORK, July 27.—(AP)—Despite the record-breaking heat wave and drought which paralyzed business activity over a wide area, the Dun & Bradstreet Weekly Review says in the majority of leading cities retail sales are being maintained above the 1933 level by a range of 5 to 20 per cent.

When it was considered that at this period a year ago there was underway a broadened consumer buying program inspired by fears of inflation which led to the large accumulation of all types of goods, the agency added, "considerable encouragement" is to be gained from the fact that "there was nothing of major importance to elicit discouragement in the week's progress."

The Review stated the heat and drought in the western and southwestern states had led to conservation of funds for emergency purposes and that the unsettled labor situation on the Pacific coast and in some mid-west cities had caused considerable damage to business, but in the south Atlantic, New England and middle Atlantic states, gains were reported all along the line.

Predicting the fall upturn may be later in making its appearance than has been indicated at the close of the second quarter, the survey says that the rapid extension of the drought-stricken areas and the intensity of the devastation "will make serious inroads" on farming purchasing power.

"In addition," it was concluded, "the amount of money available for investment in merchandising in industrial centers is being curtailed by the epidemic of strikes."

The business activity barometer of the agency dropped a full point to 52.7.

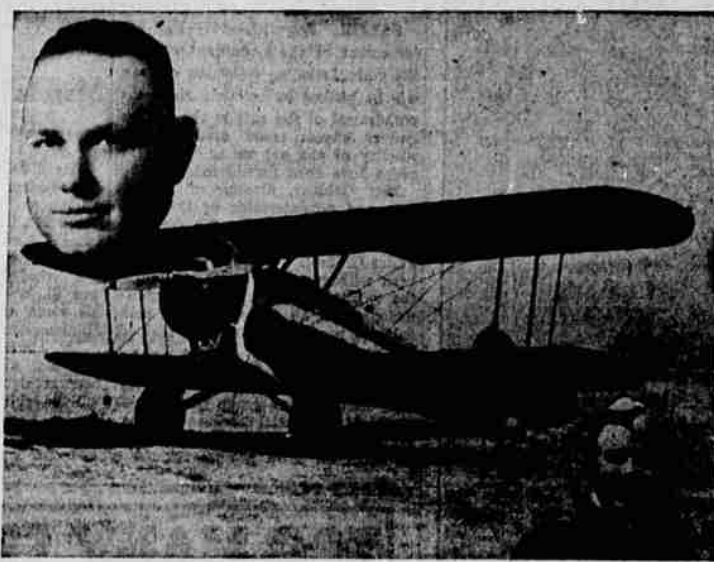

most professionally decorated sandwich.

The recipe for the tomato-ginger conserve is as follows:

Drain juice from fresh or canned tomatoes. Mix 2 cups pulp with 2 cups chopped apple, 1 lemon, put through the food chopper and 4 tablespoons preserved chopped ginger. Cook 15 minutes, add 3 cups sugar and continue cooking until mix is thick and clear. Pour into clean, hot jars and seal.

The easiest way to prepare the remaining ingredients is to put them through the food chopper one after the other. The apple will lose its identity, the lemon will be chopped fine and the ginger will be in fine pieces. Cooking the ingredients for 15 minutes permits the bits of lemon skin to become soft and transparent whereas if they were cooked first in the sugar syrup they might become hard.—Melus Hill, 1468 Hilliard street, Eugene.

Combination Luncheon Salad

Arrange three crisp lettuce leaves on each plate. In one place a small tomato stuffed with salmon and chopped celery mixed with mayonnaise and garnished with diced pickles. On the second leaf place a mound of green peas and flanked with asparagus tips. The third leaf holds a ring of pineapple with cottage cheese. In the center of the salad plate, place a spoonful of mayonnaise.

Peanut Fudge Square

1 pkg. chocolate snaps.
2 tsp. baking powder.
1/4 tsp. salt.
1-3 cup peanut butter.
3-4 cup sugar.
2 sq. chocolate (melted).
1 egg, well beaten.
1 tsp. vanilla.
1/2 cup milk.

To snap add baking powder and salt. Cream peanut butter and sugar. Blend chocolate and add egg and vanilla. Add crumbled snaps alternately with milk, beating until smooth. Bake in greased shallow pan (375 degrees) 10-15 minutes. Cool and cut in squares.—E. Libke, 1045 Onyx street, Eugene.

AUSTRIAN REVOLT STORY

ters estimated that 180 heimwehr men had been killed in Austria by last midnight.

This estimate did not include the casualties in the regular army, in the police, in the gendarmerie and among the Nazis.

This same source estimated that the Nazis had lost 2500 dead and wounded.

All death estimates at present are unreliable, but the best sources indicated that the average death total of all forces including the Nazis already have greatly exceeded 500.

ITALY MAY INTERVENE

ROME, July 27.—(AP)—A govern-

ment spokesman tonight said Italy would intervene in Austria if the internal situation there justifies the step.

His declaration marked an advance in the Italian viewpoint which was hitherto that Italy would intervene in Austria if Austrian independence was threatened from outside that country.

When he made this statement, the spokesman said that reports from Austria were considered quieting but that other reports here told of sharp fighting going on in Carinthia.

The spokesman said that if action is required in Austria, Italy will not feel it necessary to delay for any diplomatic steps such as another diplomatic protest, a final ultimatum to Berlin, or a warning to Austrian Nazis.

SWISS TROOPS CALLED

GENEVA, July 27.—(AP)—Diplomatic circles reported today that the annual maneuvers of the first division of the Swiss army will be advanced two weeks, particularly as the result of the recent seizure on Lake Constance of explosives being smuggled from Germany to Austria.

In foreign quarters, importance was given to the address delivered by President Pilet-Golaz at the Fribourg marksmanship competition yesterday.

In his speech, the chief executive said Switzerland was inflexible determined to be in a position to defend her frontiers.

"The capacity of defense is the first condition of our security."

OTTO WATCHFUL

BRUSSELS, July 27.—(AP)—Archduke Otto, claimant to the Austrian and Hungarian throne, and other Hapsburgs living in Belgium are watching the Austrian situation with the keenest interest, but comment on their behalf was declined.

and the probable cancellation of several schedules which had provided for additional steamer calls here.
