DOG RACES ENABLE COUNTY FAIRS OF STATE TO GO ON

PORTLAND, Aug. 23.—(AP)—State Senator Allen A. Bynon declared last night that dog race revenue has enabled Oregon fairs to continue in spite of the last two years of "economic distress."

Senator Bynon presented the derby trophy last night at Multnomah stadium where 20,000 persons saw Free Wheeling win the classic, paying his backers \$15.36, \$5.34 and \$4.18.

"When the racing bill was before the 1933 session of the legislature many men questioned whether racing would find support by our people," Bynon said.

"It would seem that this great gathering here tonight affords the answer. It would also appear that clean sport, honestly managed and capably conducted, has merited and received our approval."

The state fair, numerous county fairs and Pacific International livestock exposition could not have continued without the extra revenue, Bynon said.

The dogs yielded the state \$81,000 last year and \$80,000 is anticipated this year.

ENROLLMENT RECORD IS REACHED IN CCC DROUGHT AREA WORK

WASHINGTON, Aug. 23.—(AP)—Enrollment in the Civilian Conservation Corps today reached an all time peak of 362,000, within \$5,000 of the total number authorized by President Roosevelt.

Officials of the corps here said the enrollment of 50,000 men in the "midwestern drought area," which the president ordered recently had been completed.

Officials estimate that young men at work in the forest camps and other projects of the CCC are sending checks totaling approximately \$6,500,000 monthly to more than 300,000 families.

The men are paid \$30 a month, and those taken in from relief rolls are required to agree that they will allot from \$20 to \$24 a month to their dependents.

War veterans enrolled are not required to make definite allotments for their families but the officials said that most of them send checks home voluntarily.

The highest number of men in the CCC prior to the replacement and drought relief enrollment just completed was 301,000 last January.
