

FRENCH CAPTURE TWO SUSPECTS AS ASSASSIN'S AIDES

an automatic pistol clip of the same type as the one used in the assassination of King Alexander.

The two prisoners' passports showed they had been issued in Trieste.

Belgians Give Warning

The police said they believed the two men and the suspects were part of a huge terrorist gang determined to slay not only King Alexander but high military officials of France as well. They said the two men they held were to have remained in Paris to make the second attempt at the king's life if Alexander failed at Marseille.

Benet, under a French police grilling, told his questioners that his friend Netock was really Nikomir Nalis, whom police had been seeking as a terrorist agitator ever since Belgian authorities, two weeks ago, told them he was on French soil and intended to assassinate Alexander.

France prepared to bury her beloved statesman, Barthou, even as she guarded against the safety of the new king of Yugoslavia, 11-year-old Peter II, and his mother, the widow Queen Marie. Madame Leleux, the wife of the president of France, offered herself as a pledge of Queen Marie's safety, for disguised with a heavy veil, she rode through the streets of Paris in an automobile with her husband, sitting in the place of honor that spectators might think she was the Yugoslav queen.

Queen Marie, meanwhile, was smuggled from the Marseille train to the Yugoslav legation where she joined her son.

PETER NAMED KING

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, Oct. 11.—(AP)—The boy Crown Prince Peter was proclaimed king of Yugoslavia today by both houses of parliament sitting as a national assembly.

In a series of speeches, and silence, broken only by the spoken pledges, the members sitting as a national assembly took the oath to make the 11-year-old son of the slain Alexander King Peter the second.

ITALIAN CONSUL MOBBED

LIUBJANA, Yugoslavia, Oct. 11.—(AP)—Authorities here disclosed today that secretary of the Italian consulate was severely pummeled, but not seriously injured, Tuesday evening by a crowd which had just learned of the assassination of their king, Alexander.

The announcement of his death brought great masses of citizens out into the market square and surrounding streets. The secretary of the Italian consulate, happening to pass by, was speedily recognized. The crowd cried out derisively against Italy, then seized the Italian officials. Police intervened immediately, freed the Italian before he was seriously injured, and escorted him home.

W. C. T. U. PASSES RESOLUTIONS FOR DRY WORK AT MEET

Resolutions supporting the dry movement in the state, hitting at bad motion pictures, supporting the world peace movement, and another urging development of work among young people towards temperance, were among those passed at the recent meeting of the county W. C. T. U. convention in Springfield.

The resolutions follow:

"Whereas, the liquor traffic has always produced poverty instead of relieving it, and whereas it has always contributed to moral degradation and political corruption, and whereas in the past it was found impossible to control;

"Whereas, intemperance, drunken driving, accidents, and serious conditions of various kinds, have increased in city, state and country, to such an extent that the W. C. T. U. is more strongly confirmed in its belief, that outlawing of the traffic is the best method of controlling it;

"Whereas, the Knox law prohibits the advertising of alcoholic beverages, and whereas there has been such advertising by various means, including the display of liquor floats in the parade of the Oregon Trail celebration;

"Whereas, provision is made in the Knox law for local option, and protection of dry sections;

"Therefore, be it resolved that we endorse the work for Lane county and Oregon 'dry' movements."

"Whereas, moving pictures are setting a bad example for children and young people, and whereas they have not, thus far, to our knowledge, made any reform, except to take action to allow the objectionable pictures at the expense of the producer instead of at the expense of the theatre management;

"Therefore, resolved that we work earnestly for cleaner moving pictures."

"Whereas, the League of Nations has had almost unsurmountable obstacles to overcome; and whereas, the facts concerning the activities of the munitions are being uncovered by an investigating committee;

"Resolved that we consistently and earnestly lend our support to the advancement of world peace."

"Whereas, young people are now

brought into very frequent and involuntary contact with liquor temptations; whereas the government and many people approve liquor drinking for the sake of revenue;

"Whereas, practically every moving picture has drinking scenes (usually with no moral attached) or displays 'other' approval of liquor drinking, or gives out false information with regard to prohibition;

"Whereas, if young people seek truth concerning these things, they need seek it elsewhere than in the movies and the press;

"Therefore, be it resolved, that we develop the L. T. L. and Y. P. R. departments of the W. C. T. U. in order to invoke the interest of all youth in seeking truth concerning the liquor problem, and the temperance cause, and to interest them in signing total abstinence pledges for the purpose of attaining to the highest achievements in life, and for the best enjoyment of living."

"Whereas, the Bible is the best guide, and highest authority, for parents and teachers to use in training children;

"Whereas, it teaches the love of God and Christ for humanity, and teaches love of God and fellow-man;

"Whereas, it teaches how to live, and how to live joyously;

"Whereas, it teaches youth to honor father and mother;

"Whereas, it teaches respect for law and order;

"Resolved that we lend our support and encouragement to week day and vacation Bible schools."

The convention address was given by Rev. M. S. Weber of Eugene. He spoke on Temperance, and recent work pertaining to it.

ment fixed when he was arraigned on the extortion indictment. As a technicality to clear the Bronx county court record, the court also paroled Hauptmann on his own recognizance.

This, however, gave the prisoner no freedom, as the extradition warrant was immediately served on him by Lieutenant James J. Finn, of the New York police department, and he was placed in the custody of two New York detectives.

A few minutes before he went with his client before Judge Barrett, Fawcett said Mrs. Hauptmann was prepared to testify that she was with her husband the night of March 1, 1932, the night of the kidnapping, and that he could not have participated in the crime.

"Your statement then is that Hauptmann was not in New Jersey on the night of March 1, 1932?" Fawcett was asked.

"That's not my statement," Fawcett replied. "That's what Hauptmann tells me."

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mitted as they are ineligible for citizenship. Efforts to base wages on the cost of living, the resolutions committee declared, was one of the causes of the depression.

The committee reported that during recent years when the volume of production was increasing in monetary value the total amount of wages was decreasing, seriously curtailing the buying power of the people.

Attacking a substance wage, the report of the A. F. of L. executive council, pointed out that under the economy act the wages of government employees were reduced 15 per cent. at the same time the government was urging private employers to increase wages.

The executive council's report called for support of legislation for mothers' pension laws for dependent children and for old age pension laws also was approved by the convention.

An attempt by the rank and file organization in the A. F. of L. convention to switch the convention support to the Lunden unemployment bill from the Wagner-Lewis bill was promptly turned down.

President Green branded the rank and file move as "inspired by the communistic headquarters in New York City" and ruled the spokesman for the Lunden bill was out of order.

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
