Recipes which were prepared by Miss Bailey at the first day of the cooking school follow:

Irish Pig

Select uniform size potatoes for baking and wash thoroughly. Use apple core knife and make hole through center of potatoes lengthwise. Have sausages partly cooked. Place sausage in hole of potato and bake in moderate oven 375 degrees F. until potatoes are done. Service with braised liver and vegetables.

Mystery Cake

4 tablespoons Crisco.
1 cup sugar.
2 eggs (yolk).
2 cups Fisher's Blend flour.
1 teaspoon soda.
1 teaspoon allspice.
1 teaspoon cinnamon.
2 teaspoons Rumford baking powder.

1 can tomato soup.
1 cup nut meats.
1 cup raisins.

Pineapple Delight

1 cup canned pineapple.
1 cup marshmallows.
1 cup cream whipped.
1 cup macaroons.
1 cup dates.

Mix pineapple with marshmallows cut in quarters, macaroons crumbled, and dates pitted and cut in small pieces. Fold in cream and chill. Serve with cherries and nuts.

Cider Salad

Dissolve one envelope of plain gelatin in one cup of hot cider. Add one cup of cold cider and when mixture begins to thicken, add one-half cup finely cut celery and one-half cup diced apple to which has been added one tablespoon lemon juice. Pour into flat mould and chill. Serve on lettuce with mayonnaise and Imperial cheese sticks.

Braised Liver and Vegetables

1 lb. beef liver.
1 1/2 tablespoons Fisher's Blend flour.

1/2 teaspoon salt.
1-2 teaspoon pepper.
2 tablespoons Crisco.
1 medium onion sliced.
1/2 cup diced celery.
2 carrots sliced.
2 cups strained tomatoes.
1/2 bay leaf.

Method: Cut liver in 2-inch squares and roll in seasoned flour. Brown on all sides in shortening. Remove. Arrange in casserole. Brown onion, celery, and carrots slightly in same shortening, then place in casserole dish with liver, tomatoes, and bay leaf. Cover and bake at 350 degrees F. for 1 1/2 hours or until liver and vegetables are tender.

Corn Muffins

1 1/2 cups Fisher's Blend flour.
2 tablespoons sugar.
2 eggs (well beaten).
1 cup milk.
2 1/4 teaspoons Rumford's baking powder.

1/2 teaspoon salt.
1/2 cup yellow corn meal.
4 tablespoons melted Crisco.

Method: Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder, sugar, and salt and sift again. Add corn meal and mix well. Combine eggs, milk, and shortening; add to flour, stirring only enough to dampen all flour. Bake in greased muffin pans in hot oven 425 degrees F. 25 minutes. (Makes 12 muffins). May also be baked in greased breadstick pans. Left over corn muffins are delicious when split and toasted. One-half cup of minced ham or bacon added to this recipe makes an interesting variation.

through improper use," and it was found that parachutes would not have saved any lives.

Accidents happen so quickly, he added that those unfamiliar with the use of parachutes do not find them of any service.

Their use on transports," he said, "would increase the hazard through improper use."

Lindbergh said he believed "we could inaugurate a transoceanic mail route within a few months time."

The planes now being built could be used for that service, he added. At the start he said, daily schedules should not be attempted but that should be left for future progress.

Asked his opinion regarding proposed floating airbases and catapults for transoceanic flying, Lindbergh replied that "it seems doubtful to my mind that that is not a temporary development."

Lindbergh said present planes had a cruising range of 3,000 miles, and predicted planes with a range of 4,000 miles "in a few months."

"The future of long distance flying," he said, "is going to be at fairly high altitudes, with super-charged cabins or supercharged cockpits or both."

He said transoceanic planes should be able to fly over storm areas.

Asked about dirigible transoceanic flights, Lindbergh said airplanes were better suited to high altitudes but cautioned that "we should carry on with both until we are definitely convinced that one will supersede the other or that there is a place for both."

Lindbergh said plane procurement by the government should not be determined on price alone, and added it would be "almost hopeless" to lay down highly detailed specifications.

LICENSE TAG FOUND

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 16.—(AP)—Alice Stoll engaged in intensive target practice with a high powered rifle for several weeks prior to last Wednesday when she was kidnapped, it was learned today.

The revelation was the first indication that the Stoll family may have feared the impending tragedy and that the 28-year-old society woman was taking steps to guard against it.

While hopes mounted for safe return of the missing kidnap victim, additional new clues were uncovered.

In Fort Wayne, Ind., a mutilated Kentucky license plate was discovered. That precipitated an investigation there on the possibility it had been discarded by the Stoll kidnaper.

This fit in with the theory of authorities here that the seat of negotiations between abductor and family may have been shifted from Nashville, Tenn., to some Indiana city, possibly Indianapolis.

Pineapple Cheese Salad

1 level tablespoon gelatin
1/4 cup cold water
1/4 cup boiling water
2-3 cupful grated cheese
1 cup crushed pineapple
1 tablespoon sugar
Few grains salt
1/2 cup cream whipped

Soak gelatin in the cold water about five minutes and dissolve in boiling water; add sugar, salt, garlic and pineapple. When it begins to stiffen beat in the whipped cream and grated cheese. Turn into small wet molds. Unmold and serve on shredded lettuce with mayonnaise. Sprinkle the mayonnaise with finely chopped red and green peppers.—Mrs. M. Johnson, 591 West Broadway, Eugene.

FARMER STATES HAUPTMANN SEEN AT LINDY ESTATE

combating Hauptmann's plea for a writ to escape extradition on charges of murdering the Lindbergh baby.

The witness unhesitatingly stepped from the stand. He walked briskly to a position just behind Hauptmann, reached out and placed a hand on the prisoner's left shoulder.

Hauptmann did not look up. Whited returned to the stand.

Glance was Fleeting

Whited, a small scale farmer and lumberman of the backwoods type, told his story with confidence, and answered brightly when Defense Counsel J. M. Fawcett questioned his testimony.

The witness swore he did not see a photograph of Hauptmann until after he had identified the suspect.

Whited testified in the climactic effort of Wilentz to prove Hauptmann was at the scene of the crime about the time of the kidnapping.

Earlier, Albert Osborne, noted handwriting expert, had said Hauptmann wrote the ransom notes in which the writer "confessed"—Wilentz said—that he had been in the Lindbergh home.

Whited admitted his first glance at Hauptmann had been fleeting. He was in his automobile driving home, he said. He allegedly saw Hauptmann through the windshield of his automobile as he allegedly came out of the woods.

Whited also admitted that the second time he alleged he saw Hauptmann near the Lindbergh home he (Whited) was again driving along the road, this time in a truck.

The second glimpse also was brief. The state rested its case and Fawcett called rebuttal witnesses.

They testified that Whited's reputation among his neighbors was "not much" as far as his veracity was concerned.

"X" FOUND PECULIAR

NEW YORK, Oct. 16.—(AP)—Albert D. Osborne, handwriting expert, testifying today in the extradition hearing of Bruno Richard Hauptmann, told Supreme Court Justice Ernest E. L.

Hammer that the "evidence of identity is absolutely overwhelming in this case."

The witness previously had testified that the peculiar formation of the letter "X" in the Lindbergh kidnap notes and Hauptmann's writing had led him to the opinion Hauptmann wrote the original ransom note found in the Lindbergh home the night the baby was kidnapped. James M. Fawcett, defense counsel, tried unsuccessfully to wring from Osborne an admission that undotted "I's" were characteristic of workmen, such as carpenters. Hauptmann is a carpenter.

"I have never seen any connection between 'I' dotting and carpentry," Osborne replied.

Mine owners and the government reached an agreement. Peace emissaries were allowed by the strikers' guards to go below with the offer and the men debated. At daylight they came out.

All their demands were not met.

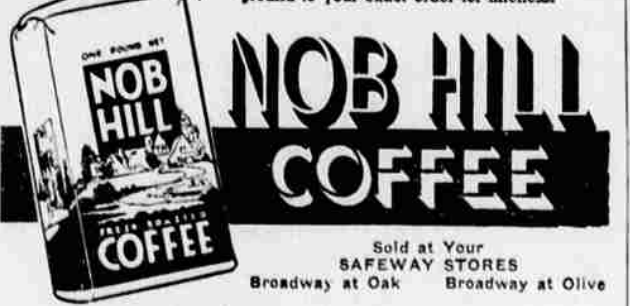
