

FRANCE, GERMANY SIGN AGREEMENT FOR SAAR PEACE

Spanish delegate, calls for the payment of Germany of 900,000,000 francs for the mines, which are the property of the French government, and for the private credits held by France, as well as a payment of 11,000,000 tons of coal from the Saar mines.

France and Germany, by the accord, reached an agreement on a method of payment which will not interfere with Germany's foreign exchange.

Olivan said the committee of three, composed of himself, Baron Pompeo Aloisi of Italy, and Ambassador Cantillo of Argentina, had received from the league council only a mandate of forming proposals to be laid before the council, but had been able to go beyond this mandate and reach a direct agreement between the two interested parties which had been signed today by the German and French ambassadors.

Victory for League

"This is a success for the League of Nations," said Olivan. "At the same time, the committee expresses the hope that this accord will bring peace to Europe."

The Spanish delegate paid warm tribute to the spirit of co-operation manifested by France and Germany during the committee's meetings and paid personal tribute to the other delegates.

The agreement naturally depends on whether Germany wins the plebiscite to be held next month in the Saar, but a victory by Germany there now is taken for granted.

Diplomatic sources, in commenting on the agreement, said they were particularly struck by Germany's guarantee in reference to race, since they mean that the Jews will have equal rights in the Saar.

An official communique on the agreement, which was reached through the two nations' respective ambassadors to Rome, said the agreement included not only the financial question of the territory, but all other points. It is to be presented Wednesday to the League of Nations council, the body charged with the government of the mining area.

FLOODED RIVERS REDEED
MELBOURNE, Australia, Dec. 3.—(AP)—Flooded rivers in the state of Victoria were receding today, leaving thousands of frightened residents isolated, 40 dead and some 8,000 homeless.

The state had feared the worst disaster in its history during the rise of the waters of the Yarra and other rivers. Damage was estimated at £1,000,000 (about \$5,000,000).

and overflowed two thickly populated and low-lying farming areas north and east of Melbourne.

Residents took refuge in trees, on rooftops and on hills. Many were forced to beat off snakes swimming in the floodwaters during the night, and were without food.

A wind and rainstorm which pounded the coast for two days also caused heavy property damage. The coastal steamer Coramba apparently foundered in the storm with a loss of 17 lives. The steamer was washed ashore yesterday, as were two bodies bearing lifebelts.

The purpose will be to place people on lands where they have some chance of obtaining a decent living from the products they can raise.

Public Works Studied

One way of determining what lands are unsuited to public occupancy will be by checking areas on which taxes have not been paid and areas in which residents are on relief rolls. When areas in which both factors exist are found, it is reasonable to assume they are unfit for public occupancy, it has been pointed out.

The subdivision on public works is headed by C. C. Hockley, state engineer for the public works administration. It is thought this committee will recommend some form of program outlining short-time public works, designed to give employment to the needy at once, and a long-time program of public works in line with a ten-year development program advocated by Governor-elect Martin.

It is believed these programs will be so designed to utilize available state, local and federal funds, the purpose of the plan being to direct the use of those available funds to the greatest possible benefit.

Another important phase of General Martin's program, as announced by him Nov. 14, is the "advancement of public welfare." Dr. P. A. Parsons, of the sociology department at the university, is chairman of this committee. Its recommendations are expected to follow the line of coordinating local, state and federal relief and to suggest means of handling this problem with the greatest efficiency and to the greatest benefit of the state at large.

The meeting Wednesday will be held at the Portland Hotel, starting at 10 o'clock, according to Dr. Parsons. The committee consists of Ormond H. Bean, city commissioner of Portland; Guy Boyington, county judge at Astoria; Regional Forester C. J. Buck; D. C. Henry, consulting engineer; Ed W. Miller, Coast Highway association

the legislature pass three enabling acts, enabling the state, counties and cities to appoint planning commissions with real authority to act. This legislation also would permit appropriation of tax funds to carry on planning work.

Since the prime purpose of the governor's committee is to direct the utilization of the state's resources to the greatest advantage, several resource surveys, of which the mineral resource survey now under way is a part, are planned.

Land Reclassifying Up

One of the important items in Governor Martin's program is expected to be the reclassification of public lands with the view of enabling people to earn a better living off the lands in this state. Committees to report on this phase are the agriculture committee, headed by Dean William A. Schoenfeld, O. S. C.; forestry, C. J. Buck, regional forester; land classification and use, Sinclair Wilson, U. S. forest experimental station; mineral resources, Prof. J. H. Hatchell, president of the state mining board; and water resources, G. H. Canfield, U. S. Geological survey.

Exactly what recommendations will be made is not known, but it is expected that submarginal lands, areas on which it has been shown people cannot make a decent living, will be reclassified as forest lands, grazing areas, recreation areas, game preserves, etc.

Drunk Tests Talked

Following his announcement Saturday regarding tests for persons arrested on drunken driving charges, Dr. George Simon, chairman of the police committee of the city council, said Monday he would call the committee into session in a day or two for the purpose of working out plans to test these suspects as they are brought into the station.

The committee will meet with the chief of police and with the city attorney to discuss the plans and will submit recommendations to the city council at its next meeting, Monday night, Dec. 10, Mr. Simon said.

It is believed that if everyone arrested on drunken driving charges is taken before a medical man for examination, the evidence thus obtained from a disinterested expert will be conclusive when placed before a jury.

Case is Appealed

The state and city laws regarding drunken driving provide that arresting officers may take suspects before a "duly licensed physician" for examination, this report being admissible as evidence in any court. This practice has never been carried out here. Chief of Police Carl Bergman, in advocating this plan, stated that evidence of this kind would be of great aid in curtailing drunken driving and the accompanying accidents.

The case of Edward McCormick, who was convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor by a police court jury last week, will be submitted to the circuit court on an appeal filed by McCormick's attorney. The papers on the case will be sent to the county Tuesday.
