

DR. TITUS WINS HONOR FROM LIONS INTERNATIONAL CLUB

Signal honor came to Dr. Harry W. Titus from the Lions International Club, Wednesday, when he was awarded a gold master key from the organization in recognition of his outstanding service and in securing 12 new members for his club. Dr. Titus is a past president of the Eugene club. He is the first one of the local group to get a master key and is one of only four in Oregon. There are but 381 now in the entire international of many thousands members. Dr. Titus has been in the Eugene club more than eight years. He was a charter member of the Cottage Grove club which held a joint installation and charter night with the Eugene club.

The presentation of the key was made at the regular luncheon meeting of the Eugene club, Wednesday noon. La Verne Hawn, president of the club now, giving the key to Dr. Titus and extending to him the club's congratulations.

Dr. Titus declared he deeply appreciated the honor, chiefly because of the outstanding work and service the Eugene club has done for the community.

At the Wednesday meeting of the club, plans were completed for one of the group's major gatherings of the year—the luncheon and party to be given next Wednesday for the Boy Scouts troop sponsored by the Lions. All members of the troop, led by Spence Holland, also member of the club, will be guests at the luncheon which is to be a Christmas party. Rev. Milton S. Weber, A. A. Reid, Dr. Titus, and A. A. Reid are in charge of the party, assisted by Mr. Holland. The club members also were urged to attend the Boy Scouts court of honor to be held the coming Friday evening, the Lions club troop hoping to retain its banner.

Further plans were talked for the clothes and toy drive being conducted by the club for the Red Cross and Welfare League. The clothes drive is looked to be finished the coming Wednesday.

The final big push on the toy drive will end next Saturday morning when another toy matinee will be given at the Heilig Theatre, admission to be a toy per person.

Dr. P. J. Bartle, Wednesday, urged the club members to remember their interest in the blind, a project of the international, and urged them to back the bill coming before the legislature to help the blind.

Time Micrometer Is Installed Here

Installation of a "Time Micrometer," a device for timing watches, was announced here Wednesday by O. L. Skele, of Skele's Jewelry store. This is the first machine of this type to be placed in operation on the west coast.

The instrument, by means of electrical impulses, indicates accurately the operation of any watch, showing whether it is running fast or slow. By means of headphones which may be plugged into the machine, every noise in the watch may be detected, thus enabling the watch-maker to determine exactly what may be wrong with a watch, Mr. Skele said.

The watch to be tested is placed on the machine and the impulses indicate how the watch is running in comparison with a "master watch." There is no deviation from absolute accuracy in the recording shown by the dials on the machine as the instrument can only show exactly what the watch is doing, it was said.

Ex-Fire Chief Of Baker Visits Here

Frank H. Grabner, vice president of the Oregon State Fire Fighters association, who recently resigned as fire chief of the city of Baker after 27 years on that department, is in Eugene visiting relatives and friends. Chief Grabner is recognized as being responsible for building the Baker department into one of the most efficient departments in the state. He has been with the Baker department almost from its inception.

Grabner resigned a few weeks ago and as a tribute to his leadership and ability, he was presented with a gold emblem. He is well-known throughout the state for his interest in fire fighting and fire prevention. It was said. He is enroute to California for a visit with relatives there.
