

CLEAN-UP OF BEER PARLORS ON PARK STREET DISCUSSED

Possibility of a clean-up of the beer parlor situation on Park street was seen here Wednesday with announcement from the city police committee that proprietors of beer dispensing establishments on Park street would be asked to meet with the committee to discuss the situation.

It was expected the meeting would be held prior to the council meeting Monday and Dr. George Simon, chairman, indicated the proprietors would be asked to consider the matter of seeking new locations for their places of business.

At the same time the police committee announced that information from the state liquor commission indicated there would be fewer beer dispensing licenses granted here this year, as a part of the commission's policy to cut down on the number of such establishments.

There are approximately 60 beer licenses in Eugene at present. "All complaints against beer parlors concern those operating on Park street," Dr. Simon said. "The committee feels this situation must be improved and we are asking the proprietors of these establishments to cooperate with us in this matter."

Nothing was said as to what might be done if proprietors refused to cooperate in the matter of seeking new locations, but Dr. Simon pointed out that no licenses would be granted by the state commission without the recommendation of the city council. Thus if the council decided to clean-up this section they could do so by refusing their approval of the license applications.

Dr. Simon also declared Wednesday that no license would be granted for beer sales in the university zone, established last year.

The council has taken no action on any recommendation as yet, Dr. Simon said.

ASK FOR CANDY

Several requests have come in for candy recipes. We had a topic on this subject last year. The past week's contest on walnuts and filberts brought in some excellent candy recipes. Several of them have been published and more are printed today and tomorrow. Also, one of the prize winners, that of Mark Christensen, was about as delicious candy as you would want to eat.

Here's another simple and delicious candy we print for the benefit of those wanting a recipe or two for the holidays.

Fudge With Honey—2 cups sugar; 4 tablespoons of honey; 1 1/2 cups of milk; 1 teaspoon of salt; 2 tablespoons butter; 1 cup nuts, not chopped. Stir together all ingredients except butter and nuts, and cook until a little dropped in some cold water forms a soft ball. Add butter and set aside, without stirring, until almost cold. Then stir with spoon until creamy, add the nuts, turn on a greased platter and knead for several minutes. Shape portions in long rolls and slice for serving.

1 cup flour, sifted

1/4 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. soda

1 tsp. vanilla

2 cups brown sugar

2 cups broken walnut meats

2 eggs

1. Stir flour once, then with the salt and soda.

2. Add brown sugar and nuts to the flour mixture.

3. Beat the eggs thoroughly.

4. Add vanilla to eggs and stir into flour and nut mixture.

5. Spread on well-greased cookie sheet or pan and bake 15 min. at 325 degrees.

About 3 dozen 2 inch squares, as good as they are simple.—Mrs. Hamilton Griffin, 2645 Chula Vista.

Nut Jelly

6 tabs. tapioca

3 cups hot water

2 cups brown sugar

1 cup walnuts, broken

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

Stir tapioca into hot water. Add salt and brown sugar. Cook in double boiler till tapioca is clear, stirring frequently. When done, turn into bowl to cool. Then add vanilla and nut meats. Chill. Serve with cream, either plain or whipped. This makes a delicious dessert.—Mrs. A. C. Bouck, 1780 Columbia St., Eugene.

OREGON OLD AGE INSURANCE URGED BY CHARLES GRAM

PORTLAND, Dec. 19.—(AP)—A system of age insurance incorporating some of the elements of employment insurance, to be controlled by the state, collected by the state, and paid by the state, is to be proposed to the Oregon legislature at the January session.

The announcement was made by Charles H. Gram, state labor commissioner, in an address last Tuesday at the 29th annual meeting of county judges and commissioners of Oregon. The plan Gram has in mind would be self-supporting. Every employee over 18 years of age would be taxed one per cent of his wage, but not to exceed \$15 a year. From this fund perhaps \$60 a month would be paid to every citizen as he becomes unable to work or reaches the age of 60 years.

Governor-elect Martin, who likewise addressed the county judges and commissioners, explained that he was inclined to believe Oregon should postpone any action on old age or employment insurance until after the federal government has indicated what steps, if any, it will take in this direction.

Gram suggests the tax be collected by the state tax commission, and that the insurance or "pension" be disbursed by the state industrial accident commission. Thus no additional machinery would have to be set up, and economy of administration would be guaranteed.

The labor commissioner explained that if the federal government also decides at the next session of congress, or later, to adopt some form of old age pension, the bill he proposes would authorize Oregon to make whatever change would be necessary in the Oregon law to dovetail the two insurance plans.
