

LARSEN DESCRIBES PROGRESS MADE IN HOUSEHOLD DEVICES

Larry Larsen, district representative of the F. B. Connelly Co., Portland, who set up factory distributors of Grunow products and ABC washers, is a Eugene visitor, adding Lyons & Carey to the opening of their new store.

Mr. Larsen expressed enthusiasm in the new dealer arrangement here. He remarked that "Throughout the country stores of this type are becoming a greater factor in the appliance business. CHANCELLOR ISSUE CAUSE OF "SPLIT" IN U. OF O. GROUPS

PORTLAND, Ore., May 24.—(AP)—With their forces split, supporters of University of Oregon will propose and oppose abolition of the office of chancellor of higher education here Monday.

Resolutions passed by the Oregon Mothers' club and the Oregon Dad's club asking that the office of chancellor be abolished and autonomy given the various institutions of higher learning, will be presented to the board by a delegation headed by Earle Wellington, president of the dads.

At the same time the Portland chapters of the University alumni and the College alumni will present resolutions asking for retention of the chancellor post at least until the system is given a further trial. The resolution adopted by the Portland group did not mention Dr. W. J. Kerr who holds the chancellorship although he has resigned and asked to be relieved, but merely mentioned the chancellorship as a position.

Marie R. Chesser of Astoria, president of the University Alumni association, telegraphed that the resolution by the Portland chapter does not

necessarily reflect the attitude of the entire alumni as the main group has never taken any poll or action on the question.
