the Springfield quartet. Following the services at the G. A. R. plot, the Spanish American War veterans and auxiliary held their services at their plot.

Several hundreds were down town to see the annual parade on Willamette street shortly after 10 o'clock, Thursday morning. C. M. Eichler, commander of the J. W. Geary post, G. A. R. Eugene, was marshal for the parade, accompanied by Rev. W. H. Myers, chaplain of the post, and followed by others of his Union comrades.

Following the marshal's car, came the I. O. O. F. band and the three local units of the National Guard. Cars bearing others of the G. A. R. men in this vicinity followed the marching guardmen. Sons and Daughters of the Union Veterans of the Civil war and members of other G. A. R. auxiliary groups followed the old veterans. Several members from the American Legion auxiliary came next. Two of the larger marching groups followed then, about 50 veterans of the Spanish American war and members of the Spanish American War Veterans auxiliary. Next came another marching group, about 75 of the World War veterans and members of the American Legion. Winding up the marching groups section was the Lincoln school drum and bugle corps of boys and girls dressed in white with bright red helmets.

At 2:30 p. m., the Women's Relief corps and the Spanish American War Veterans auxiliary were to hold their annual water service honoring the sailor dead. This service was arranged at the East Broadway bridge over the millrace. Rev. C. S. Bergstresser, pastor of the Bethany Evangelical church, gave the address and the groups then threw their flowers on the waters. All business was closed for the day with many folk out-of-town.
