Among their choice knit pieces handed down to us are the bedspreads made of individual squares sewn together. Here is a choice square that will permit you to do what they did—a choice bit of needlework when you sew them together into the pillows, tea-cloths or spreads. A separate simple scalloped border finishes all the pieces.

Pattern 986 comes to you with detailed directions for making the pieces shown, an illustration of it and of the stitches needed; makes 16 cents in stamps or coin (coin preferred) for this pattern.
