

DR. WOOD LISTED AS AUTHORITY IN ECONOMIC FIELD

The "Author's and Writer's Who's Who," published in London, England, will contain the biography and list of books of Dr. Louis A. Wood, professor of economics at the University of Oregon, it was announced here today. The publication is regarded as the leading one of its kind in the world, and only recognized authors are included in its listings.

Dr. Wood's books to be listed include "The Kid River Colony," and "The War Chief of the Six Nations," two volumes of the "Chronicles of Canada series," "A History of Farm Movements in Canada," the standard work on this subject, and "Union-Management Co-operation On the Railroads," the result of an extensive research and investigation carried on by Dr. Wood.

Dr. Wood has been on the faculty of the university since 1924. He is a graduate of the University of Toronto, and obtained his degree of doctor of philosophy from Heidelberg university in 1911. He is regarded as an authority in the field of economics, particularly in labor relations.

J. E. Tanch, 79, died at the home of S. I. Ogden 431 East Fourteenth street in Eugene, Tuesday evening, June 11, as a result of injuries received when he was struck by a car on a street here, December 29, of last year. One of his legs was broken and he suffered other injuries which kept him confined to his bed since that time.

Mr. Tanch was born in Salem, Mass., June 12, 1856, and came west in 1880, settling in Portland. He came to Eugene in 1920. He had lived with Mr. Ogden for 35 years.

Survivors include two nephews, Chester Williams, of Denver, Colo., and Emory Tanch of Salem, Mass. He had been a member of Franklin lodge of Masons at Grafton, Mass., for 61 years.

The funeral will be held at the Veatch chapel Friday at 2 p. m. with interment in Rest Haven Memorial park. Rev. E. V. Stivers will conduct the services at the chapel and McKenzie River lodge of Masons at the grave.

Summer Playground Program Announced

SPRINGFIELD, June 12.—(Special)—A supervised summer playground for Springfield children, dream of Springfield parents for over a quarter of a century, is at last assured for 1935, according to plans formulated at a meeting of the Springfield Playground association held Tuesday night at the city council.

Mrs. Leota Rodenbough was appointed as supervisor and a playground committee of Mrs. Olive Rehman, Mrs. Milton Walker and Mrs. Willis Bertsch was appointed to see that the school board for the use of Brattain school ground and equipment. June 24 is the day set for the opening of the playground and on June 18, the association will meet again to make more complete plans.

Severt Jacobsen was elected chairman of the association when Mrs. R. E. Dawson handed in her resignation from the post at the meeting. Phil Bartholomew was selected as assistant chairman. Other officers are Mrs. Dorothy Aldrich, secretary and Mrs. Sue Chase, treasurer.

R. H. Townsend of the Eugene SERRA office attended the meeting and explained to the group that funds from the SERRA may be applied for as soon as the present project is functioning. The newly appointed playground committee is to meet Wednesday to consider the financing of the project.

Tentative plans as outlined by Mrs. Rodenbough for the summer's project called for the playground being conducted on a tournament basis with a final play day at the close. Games planned will include a tin can golf course, paddle tennis, tether ball, checkerboard benches, Old Mill board benches, a horseshoe court, deck tennis, one dirt tennis court, a volley ball court, 2 croquet sets, two tables for ping pong in the play shed. Also several projects, involving no expense to children or parents, are considered which will use old materials from homes for construction.

There will be no age limit, but older children bringing children under five years old will have to be chaperon for the child.

The committee is at present looking into a public liability policy to protect District 19 and the directors, and is also drawing up plans of the program to be handled to the school board.

The matter of a project for handicapped children, which was introduced at Tuesday's meeting, will be decided at the meeting June 18.
