

ROOSEVELT WARNS AGAINST POLITICS IN RELIEF WORK

WASHINGTON, June 21.—(AP)—A warning that politics must be kept out of relief was reiterated today by President Roosevelt as he outlined the objectives of the rural resettlement division to the aides of undersecretary Rexford G. Tugwell in a White House address.

"We cannot, must not, will not, let partisan politics interfere with this work," the president said.

"I don't care what a family calls itself, if they need help, we have got to help them out."

Mr. Roosevelt, in his brief talk to the various state administrators, advised them to center their attention on getting employable persons off the relief rolls by giving them work on community projects and by other ways.

He added, too, that the highest that could be spent per family averaged \$1.143 per year and cautioned the administrators to keep within the objectives set by the congress.

"We want to be able to devote land resources to their highest uses and approach land conservation with the future in mind," Mr. Roosevelt said. He told them to approach their problems humanly and with the highest degree of efficiency.

Mr. Roosevelt said the officials should not hesitate to inform all that they had their direct orders from him that there be no politics in the work.

BAPTIST ENTRANCE IN GENERAL FIELD OKAYED BY LEADER

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., June 21.—(AP)—The controversial proposal that the northern Baptists' convention, representing 1,500,000 persons, enter political, social and economical fields received approval today from Dr. Avery A. Shaw, convention president.

The white-haired churchman supported the movement in his opening address to convention delegates at the opening session of a six day meeting.

In his audience were many Baptists fundamentalists, at whose pre-convention conferences speakers criticized the proposed program, believing the church should confine its influence to the individual, rather than extend it to general fields. These fundamentalists saw in the proposal a move toward centralized power, opposed to their principle of supreme rule for the local church.

Fourteen hundred delegates were registered as Dr. Shaw, president of Denison university, Granville, Ohio, formally opened the convention.

Chalice Discovered Near Antioch Cave May Be Holy Grail

LONDON, June 21.—(AP)—A report tonight to the Palestine Bible lands exhibition indicated the discovery of what some experts say may prove to be the Holy Grail or chalice which Jesus used at the last supper.

The report said excavations in the cave near Antioch revealed a small chalice or cup. Experts, the report said, described the cup as of fine Roman work, dating back to about the beginning of the Christian era.
