Lettuces and loganberries are in the local markets these days but have not arrived in large quantities as they are just coming on. Lettuces are being quoted at \$2 a bushel, buying price.

Buying prices for lettuce, radishes and green onions are lower. 30 cents a bushel being offered while radishes are half a cent lower than a year ago. The prevailing price for green onions is 24 cents a pound.

CHICAGO, June 21.—(AP)—With the domestic wheat harvest reported as ten days later than normal, wheat prices tended to advance today. Oklahoma advices indicated uneasiness over delays in wheat harvest operations. Upturns of wheat prices were also attributed to stock market upticks.

LOSSES REGAINED IN NEW OUTBURST OF 'CONFIDENCE'

NEW YORK, June 21.—(AP)—The stock market today enjoyed one of its sharpest rallies in a number of months as bullish forces shed their new tax fears and reached for desired equities.

Numerous new highs for the year or longer were recorded with gains ranging from 1 to around 5 points. The close was strong.

Transfers approximated 1,600,000 shares. Secondary utility and rail bonds were in demand. Most foreign exchanges were firm in terms of the dollar.

PORTLAND MARKET NOT VERY LIVELY

PORTLAND, Ore., June 21.—(AP)—Extreme dullness was generally suggested in the market for live chickens with some recent price slumping reported. There was a real shortage of small broilers and for that reason most operators were willing to drag more or less although no further price changes were suggested for the day.

Demand for turkeys was rather slow with suggestion of poor quality as a rule. While there were no further price changes for the day in the butter market, easiness was suggested in the price structure as a result of the late decline and increasing supply.

Egg market suggested a merely steady tone locally and practically without price changes for recent days. Pullet laying was suggested as the chief reason for recent increase in the supply.

General steadiness with strength in spots is suggested in the market for country killed meats. Lamb, veal and hogs were moving out well and up to quotations. Beef alone appeared a little uneasy.

End of the season of strawberry production in volume was indicated. Prices were higher. Fancy peas were reported in from Rainier. Pea prices were firmer to higher generally.

Raspberries were in larger supply and a trifle lower. Loganberries were in like position. Old potatoes were slow but at unchanged prices, new stock a trifle easier for locals.

Green and wax beans were about 1c lb. lower generally. Cabbage and cauliflower were both lower with more arriving.

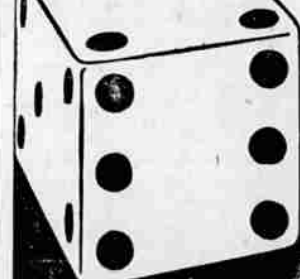
