(Proportions of ingredients to taste)
Raspberries, washed
Pineapple, sliced, cut in small pieces
Rice, boiled and cooled
Lettuce

Cut fruit into a large salad bowl and allow to chill in refrigerator. Make a dressing of 1 cup sweetened, flavored whipped cream and 1 cup pineapple salad dressing. Fold lightly into fruit and garnish with maraschino cherries.

Juice of 1 can pineapple
Juice of 1 lemon
2 tablespoons flour
