

TRANSIENT RELIEF MOST PERPLEXING ANGLE OF PROBLEM

plenty of room to locate, plenty of opportunity to make their way—and they fed themselves! What of these shifting hordes today?

Transient Family Real Riddle
As far as the county is concerned, the real problem is the transient family. "Stabilize them" is the word from the federal viewpoint. In most months the total figure shows the federal percentage running to as high as six times as great as those cared for by state funds. State funds care for those who come from Oregon points only, federal funds for those from all parts of the nation.

Symptoms Are Alarming
The county watches with apprehension the increasing total of transient families going on the indigent roll. Some arrive with a little money. They like the country, decide to settle here. They buy a little place. There, right at the beginning they find their capital gone. Some can make the grade and with a little help now and then can eventually get established. Most of these are fine citizens.

What of those who know nothing about farming? Their little stock of money, if they had any, is gone in buying a little place, and there they are, right up against direct relief—adding to the large number already there.

The relief administration makes every attempt to get stranded people back to their home section. Transportation is always by railroad, no gas or automobile equipment being supplied, and transportation costs out of the state are paid from federal funds. Transportation within the state is paid for by state funds and charged against the relief office here.

Many of the transient families are direct relief cases as soon as they arrive here. Families without funds are put up over night and provided with food. Then comes the adjustment and stabilization problem. Transient families under care through relief sources for a year, go on the general relief roll at the end of the year, supported by federal funds.

Figures can tell you much more than a lot of words, and here are a few to study:

Family Care Costs Plenty
A total of \$10,091.25 has been spent the past seven months (since January 1) through the relief administration offices here for transient families.

During the month just passed (July), 352 families, representing 533 persons, were cared for on federal funds, 10 families representing 103 persons, were cared for from state funds.

June records showed 120 families, representing 535 persons, cared for through federal funds; 18 families, totalling 86 persons, on state funds. Only one month in the seven-month period dropped below 100 families on the federal roll, that was May with 95 families. Never has the total of families for these seven months represented below 420 persons, this including only the federal funds list—those from out of the state.

So far the total transferred to general relief has not been great—but only the first seven months of the year are completed. July had one family from federal funds, totalling six persons; and two state funds families, totalling 12 persons, transferred to the general relief roll. May was the only month with a blank under the transfer entry, however, April and June had three families on federal funds transferred.

Employment Figures Gain
Only since April are there recorded entries under the heading "Secured employment." In July, 9 families, representing 39 persons, were entered under this heading from the federal transient list, and two families, totalling 13 persons, from the state roll. In June, 17 families, totalling 96 persons, went off the federal list under this heading. In May, eight families, 44 persons, went off the federal list. In April, four families, representing 19 persons, went off the list.

"Left on own accord" is another heading. This figure runs fairly high, but nothing in proportion to those remaining. Here are some of the figures: July, 62 families, representing 267 persons, left the federal list, and five families, totalling 31 persons, left the state transient list. In June, 34 federal families, reaching 160 persons total, and 4 state families, representing 13 persons, went off the list. In May, 20 federal families, 104 persons, left; in April, 54 federal families, 158 persons; five state families, 12 persons.

March was fairly high, but February and January had but small numbers leaving on their own accord.

Number of Children High
Charts on ages represented, show the larger proportion in the age groups of from 6 to 15 and 1 to 5. The figures considered, of course, include (orals)—persons represented on both federal and state lists, male and female.

A quarterly report shows 16 states outside of Oregon represented in the total of families, California leading in the outside states, with large numbers coming from Washington, South Dakota, Texas, and mid-west sections.

Case workers among the transient families have no enviable job. Many of those families are pretty straggled by the time they hit this far west with everything they possess clutched in their hands. Some prove undesirable citizens and the sad part of that condition is that the majority of the really undesirable ones are those most likely to remain for a time.
