WOOL REPORT

BOSTON, Aug. 16.—(U.S.)—The Commercial Bulletin will say tomorrow: "The movement in wool has been considerably broader this last week and prices are showing some disposition to respond to the heavier demand and certain descriptions which had been rather soft have hardened and are now in line with the general market. The trend at the moment is against the buyer. Demand favors the combing wools especially. Woolen wools are firm on moderate demand."

"In the west, there is more or less steady movement of wool in spots, at steady rates."

PORTLAND MARKET

HAS STEADY TONE

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 16.—(AP)—The butter market remained unchanged today in the Pacific northwest.

Demand for standard butter was good, particularly from the Willamette valley.

Fresh eggs showed considerable strength. Demand for light weight broiler chickens exceeded the dwindling supplies. Prices were firm to higher.

Country killed meat prices held, with receipts limited.

The first coast huckleberries of the season sold at 10c lb.

Local potatoes in greater volume softened prices.

Cantaloupes were firmer to higher at the East Side Farmers' wholesale market. Offerings were of fair volume but primary points were higher and there was no disposition on the part of the trade to cut much. Sales in general were made \$1.35-1.40 crate with some business to \$1.50.

Tomatoes were at least steady during the day with offerings not so liberal and demand good. Sales chiefly 80-85c for 1s with a few 90c.

Peaches were firmly priced for all local offerings, which included Crawford, Rochester, Altans and Slapins.
