FIFTY ASSESSMENT COMPLAINTS FILED

More than 50 complaints of property assessments have been filed with the Lane county board of equalization, according to W. B. Dillard, county clerk. This is a little less than the total number filed last year.

Monday of next week is the last day to file complaints with the board and then the board has two weeks after that time to consider them and to hold hearings. Announcement of the decision on the complaints will be made soon afterward.

The new assessor, whoever he may be, will sit in on the hearing of the complaints, and will take part in the deliberations of the board as an appointee is expected to be made in a very few days. The board is made up of the county judge, the assessor and the county clerk.
