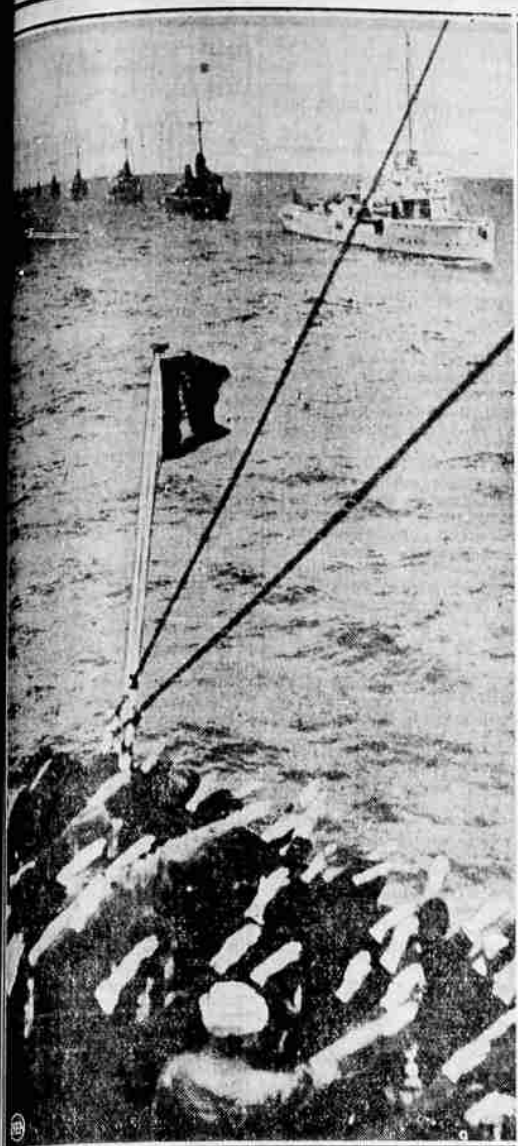


Heard While Strolling

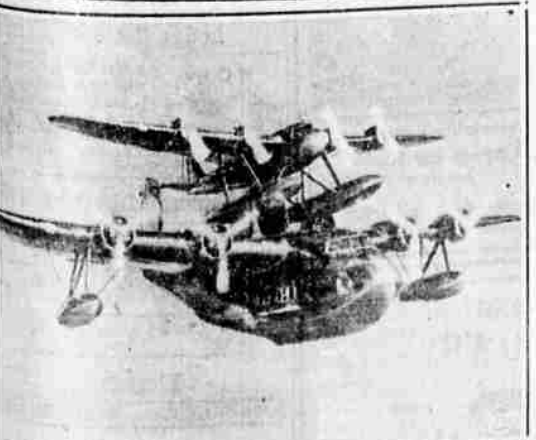
