

leave someone to tend to his duties when out of the city. It was pointed out that Dr. R. C. Romig was to take care of such cases, but council members flared back with the charges that the city never received just consideration from Dr. Romig and could not now expect it.

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An emergency ordinance was speeded through the council to permit pasteurization of milk outside the city limits as Dr. J. L. Hesse, member of the board of health, and Dr. L. G. Heltelrine, city milk inspector, appeared before the meeting to urge its passage to curb the scarlet fever threat.

Dr. Hesse Gives Report

Although Dr. Hesse said the epidemic seemed to be ended since no new cases had been reported since last Wednesday, 50 cases in the city at present constituted an emergency. He said that the scarlet fever had been traced to a cow in a dairy which supplied milk to Eugene and that the source has been eliminated. Previously dairies outside the city had to bring milk into the city in large quantities for pasteurization.

Wayne M. Akers tendered his resignation as a member of the park board because of the press of personal business. His resignation was accepted.

The ordinance which would make the mayor's appointment of the chairman of the park board dependent upon the selection of the members of the board was tabled until the next meeting because of the absence of Councilman Fred Carlson, the council's member on the board.

Grass Trimming Refused

The expense involved and because of the difficulty in collecting the assessments. An ordinance now in effect makes this mandatory on the part of the city but councilmen maintained it was unworkable. Grass on lots owned by the city will be cut as soon as possible, said F. E. Lamb, chairman of the street committee.

Council granted two recommendations of the board of appeals regarding construction of service stations. One denial for reconstruction at 11th and Jackson was sustained by a 6-0 vote. A request for a zone change at 6th and Villmore was referred to the planning commission.

To the health and fire and water committees went an appeal for the removal of a used car wrecking lot on Broadway between Lincoln and Charnelton. Objection to the lot was made by 24 property owners in the area.

Name Change Held Up

Action was held up on the city engineer's request that James street in the Chula Vista region be changed to 28th avenue to avoid confusion.

Fire Chief William Nusbaum was granted \$15 to defray expenses of a trip to Marshfield to attend a state convention of fire chiefs.

The council decided to appropriate no more relief funds for use during the summer months when seasonal labor was plentiful and to hold back such funds until late fall and winter.
