The girls will camp in units, senior, intermediate, and junior groups. This year's program will include many activities—all kinds of water sports, life-saving instruction, too, Miss Leah Young, Red Cross examiner, in charge of the life-saving instruction, many other activities. Camp Cleawox, extending along the shore of the lake and near the ocean offers many activities and activities that other camps do not have. Mrs. Winchell Speaks Mrs. George P. Winchell was speaker for the banquet, her topic being "Pursuit of Happiness." To begin her talk, Mrs. Winchell discussed briefly some of the definitions and synonyms given in the dictionary for the word happiness. One of these is comfort; but that is something too negative to really mean happiness, the speaker said. Another meaning as given is contentment, but that is too passive, she pointed out. A third meaning given is mirth, but that is not lasting enough, she commented. Still another meaning is pleasure, but that does not extend far enough, she added. "We need something deep, basic, and abiding, something that will not be upset by the ups and downs and the ills of life; something that is substantial," Mrs. Winchell stated. Some have pointed out that if we rid ourselves of the ills of life, happiness is the consequence—yet we can not laugh off those ills, the speaker declared. Others say unhappiness can be traced to three causes—lack of health, lack of love, lack of money. While it may be difficult to overcome one or all three of these lacks, nevertheless, we can make our best efforts to overcome them. Another has pointed out, the speaker continued, that there are three necessary factors for happiness—a satisfying philosophy of life; confidence in self; and something to have as work and that work to be something we like and can do. However, this latter burden is something some eleven million persons in America today have not been able to make. There is something even more basic to secure happiness, and that is to return to the teachings of Jesus—to lose sight of self and to make others happy. The other points can be combined with that principle—we can recognize the ills of life, we can have faith, and we can accept the challenge to do for others.

Mrs. Florence Murdoch, accompanied by Mrs. E. H. Moore, sang preceding the talk of Mrs. Winchell. Mrs. Murdoch is state music director for the Oregon Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs.
