

CHAMBER TO START TAX PROBE IN LANE

as Lane, thereby handicapping Lane plants in competition with those of the two northern counties who are operating practically under the old assessment basis. Local people are not complaining at an assessment equalization program but insist it should be applied simultaneously over the entire state.

Earl H. Hill and C. F. Hyde, two of Lane county's legislators, Wednesday, added their opinion to that of several of the industrialists in this section that the assessment equalization program should be applied simultaneously to all sections, rather than county by county as the commission survey is finished in each section.

Hill is Willing

Mr. Hill went further by stating: "If legislative procedure is necessary to secure this adjustment, I am willing to do all I can to further such procedure and as quickly as possible." It seems only the proper thing that such a system should be applied to all of the state at once, thus avoiding the danger of handicapping industries in certain, isolated counties by completing the reorganization of assessments there first, Mr. Hill commented.

"The assessment equalization plan should be put into effect in all counties at once," Mr. Hyde stated. He said he had not made any detailed study of the situation and did not want to commit himself further until he knew something of the other side.

Since that time however, the governor authorized the issuance of about \$250,000 worth of certificates, but only after the committee had declared that funds were necessary to take care of the needy.
