SOMETIMES a player who complains that the greens are hard, and that it is impossible to get the ball on them, is doing the very thing to get backspin on the ball—putting it before the clubhead hits into the turf—yet his ball seems to roll on considerably.

The reason for this is that he is twisting into the shot, producing backspin on the ball.

By turning the hands over as the back of the left hand is upon the club, a player can prevent this backspin, and acquire the correct backspin that is necessary to stop the ball on the green.
