SAN SEBASTIAN UNCERTAIN

HENDAYE, France, July 22.—(AP)—The fate of San Sebastian, key objective of Spain's northern rebels, was plunged into uncertainty tonight with day-long fighting reported in the streets and a loyal garrison preparing to shell rebel positions from the harbor.

Both fascist rebel headquarters in Vera, Spain, and popular front leaders holding iron claim victories in San Sebastian.

Madrid sent a gnatboat into the San Sebastian harbor, on Biscay Bay.

Its crew pinned the guns to bombard the badly-defended rebel lines.

Fascist forces in the city barricaded themselves principally in the Casino and swimming club, as well as behind paving block "forts" where guns were frequently changed.

COMMUNICATION BROKEN

TOLEDO RE-CAPTURED

C.I.O. OPENS REVOLT ON A. F. OF L. HEADS

Unless a compromise is reached within the next 12 days, it was regarded as certain that the council will veto suspension of the 12 insurgent unions. Hopes for a compromise however, appeared slim.

Green declined to predict council action. A. F. of L. leaders said a vote by the council for suspension would bar representatives of C. I. O. unions from the national convention, and thus prevent a floor fight. They were supported by an opinion of counsel for the A. F. of L.

Lewis now claims 40 per cent of the federation's 3,000,000 members. His C. I. O. has gained nearly 500,000 recruits since its formation last November. Some C. I. O. leaders predicted a majority of union workers by fall.

Friends of Lewis predicted that if the C. I. O. is forced out of the federation he will form a new labor organization and declare open war on Green for control of the organized labor movement. Lewis however, has denied any intention of seceding.

Idaho's Governor Sends State Police Into Strike Region

BOISE, Idaho, July 22.—(AP)—Twelve state patrolmen, armed with machine guns, sawed-off shotguns, pistols, rifles and tear gas bombs, moved into the strike-torn Clearwater county lumber section of Idaho today as conditions grew acute.

Governor Ben C. Ross and Emmitt Pfost, commissioner of law enforcement, said the men were dispatched at the request of Joel Wilson, sheriff of Clearwater county.

They said I. W. W. members were attempting to incite serious trouble among the lumbermen who have been on strike throughout the northern Idaho lumber belt several weeks.

ECHOES of the Dark Ages come from the slopes of a mountain peninsula in Greece that juts into the north Aegean Sea. There rises Mt. Athos, the Holy Mountain, on which some 7000 monks have joined in a sort of unique religious republic, from which all females, even female animals, are excluded. Twenty large monasteries are there, each with its own ruler, and all rulers form a council that governs the strange land.

First under the benign influence of Greece, then of Turkey, about 1000 years ago, and now back in Greek hands, the monks keep themselves entirely apart from the world, completely in ignorance of events outside. Mostly Greeks, the order also attracted Serbs, Bulgars, and Russians who sought the sequestered life. To them the sin of sins is sex; accordingly, all women, and even cats, cows, and hens are barred, to keep the Holy Mountain clean, godly, and thoroughly masculine.

One of the monasteries on Mt. Athos, that built in memory of Simon Peter, is illustrated on one of the stamps Greece issued in 1927.

Timothy, Pea Vine, Beet Give Reporter Workout in Figures

It was garden day in the Register-Guard office, and after all the weighing and measuring had been done, the reporter was supplied with enough figures to fill a chamber of commerce bulletin to overflowing on the wonders of Eugene gardens.

First, there was another green pea vine (they have been coming in throughout the spring and the contest on their size seems just well started). This vine, displayed by Scott Yount of Mapleton, measured more than 120 inches when straightened out. "This is just the shortest one I could find. I'll bring in a real one one of these days," commented Mr. Yount.

Next, there was a huge, deep red beet, measuring more than 18 inches in circumference. It weighed two pounds and 10 ounces; and in height the full plant measured slightly more than 30 inches from the tip of the greens to the root of the beet. The beet came from the fine gardens raised at the Sunset Home.

Also, from the Sunset Home gardens was displayed a bunch of timothy, some of the timothy heads measuring more than 13 inches in length.

The work would be directed by one central group, in charge of different activities, all pertaining to the public health but which are now widely scattered among different organizations.

Among the organizations now connected with public health service are the medical society, the dental society and the welfare league. Under the present plan the county court takes care of its indigents when medical aid is required, the city has its milk and meat inspection service, the schools engage in health work among the pupils and the public health association carries on tuberculosis work. All of these would be combined under one head if the plan is adopted. The proposed board would not be a levying group and would not have the power to spend money, but would be above all a directing agency of the county public health work, it was explained.

The plan is provided by state law but is optional with the different counties. The county court promises to take the matter up at a later date.
