

APPROVAL GIVEN FOR WILLAMETTE HIGHWAY PROJECTS

\$210,000 was allocated to the Willamette from federal forest road funds, but this was later reduced to \$175,000 by transfer of \$35,000 to a rush job on the Salmon river cut-off. An additional \$100,000 for the Willamette was allocated out of the federal highway funds. The additional \$75,000 of the \$350,000 was expected to be gathered from fund balances.

To complete the 4.5 miles of grading approximately \$900,000 will be needed by engineers' estimates. To complete rock surface on 56.2 miles will require an additional \$400,000, and to pave 67.1 miles with oil will require \$325,000.

Other Cities Waiting
Klamath, Eugene, Lakeview and many other communities extending south into Nevada and California hope to see enough money appropriated during the coming year to complete the grade and cover it with rock so that through traffic could be opened before the end of 1937.

The rebuilding of the connection between the Pacific highway and Lowell bridge is part of the federal bureau and state highway program for the route but since the present roads are serviceable between those points that unit will be delayed till after the main route is complete.

"The finest mountain road in the United States," is what engineers predict the new pass will be. It has minimum grades, exceptionally easy curves and is designed to carry fast heavy traffic the year round. Since the route is protected from drifts and on a south slope virtually the entire way through the Cascades, little snow difficulty is expected.

Skirts Odell Lake
From the summit the new road has been constructed along the north shore of Odell lake after which it shoots in a straight line to a junction with The Dalles-California road about 12 miles south of Crescent. Eventually a cutoff to the Fremont highway is contemplated as part of the plan of a hookup with the Lincoln highway through Lakeview and Reno.

Tentative plans call also for the eventual relocation of that portion of The Dalles-California road which now traverses Sun mountain. This grade can be eliminated by following the Klamath marshes and the Willamette river as the Southern Pacific railway does. From Klamath Falls to a junction with the main California highway system the new road cutoff is already nearing completion.

Valencia is Capital

A careful sifting of reports shows rebel activity in 21 of the country's 50 provinces. But in some of these the rebels are only active, and are not in control. The rebels claim, according to a compilation of their reports, 28 towns of importance.

FASCIST ADVANCE ON MADRID FAILS; SPANISH WARNED

north, and toward Casares, Seville, Albacete, Cadiz and Algeciras, insurgent rallying points in the south. At Tetuan, however, Gen. Francisco Franco, the Spanish rebel commander-in-chief, was quoted by a Moroccan newspaperman as saying "every thing going according to our plans... We expect victory."

In Washington, Secretary Hull announced the American Export line had agreed to divert one of its vessels to Barcelona to evacuate Americans if necessary. The state department received an urgent appeal from Consul William E. Chapman at Bilbao for a war vessel.

The American battleship Oklahoma steamed from Cherbourg, France, to Bilbao to evacuate American women and children from the Spanish north coast. Barcelona is on the Mediterranean sea.

Government bombs plummeted to rebel targets from airplanes swooping over army barracks at Zaragoza, Spain, today in a fresh assault intended to help break the back of a revolution now in its seventh day.

Running a gamut of anti-aircraft fire at this, a rebel stronghold in northeastern Spain, the planes augmented a column of militiamen organized to reinforce 4,000 loyalists determined to take Zaragoza by storm.

On a wide battlefield of the civil war, which some sources estimated had taken a toll of 25,000 dead and wounded, loyal forces of Spain's liberalist government forces marched out of Madrid to meet the threat of two fascist columns converging on the capital.

Word received in Hendaye, France, said the Madrid-bound fascist columns faced a firm defense by a trained army of 30,000 civil guards.

The most bitter fighting seemed to center around Zaragoza and Seville, in southeastern Spain, and that in itself was interrupted by observers as an indication of how widespread the rebellion remained.

A small advance party from Barcelona, approaching Zaragoza was reported ambushed by rebels and several liberalists killed.

A Spanish destroyer arrived in Barcelona harbor under the command of the second officer, the crew having arrested the captain when he attempted to join the fascist army revolution.

One of those slain outside Zaragoza was said to have been Manuel Prieto, leader of a miners' rebellion in 1932.

Gen. Vicente Gay, who had taken refuge at his country home near Grandollers, was reported slain by liberalist masses.

But the government announced, "the situation is improving from hour to hour."

Other battles were reported at Albacete, Guadalajara and other points. The government announced rebels at Cordoba, in the south, had surrendered.

British and French warnings were sent the left government at Madrid to keep its fleet out of the international harbor at Tangier. Moreover, Britain warned the rebels to keep their bombs clear of His Majesty's ships.

FIRING ENDANGERS BOWERS
WASHINGTON, July 23.—(AP)—Regular artillery fire in the direction

of San Sebastian, Spain, summer home of American Ambassador Claude G. Bowers, was reported to the state department today by American Vice Consul Cussans from the Franco-Spanish border.

"This morning there was artillery firing with considerable regularity in the direction of San Sebastian," he said in a message filed at 4 p. m. (Spanish time) today.

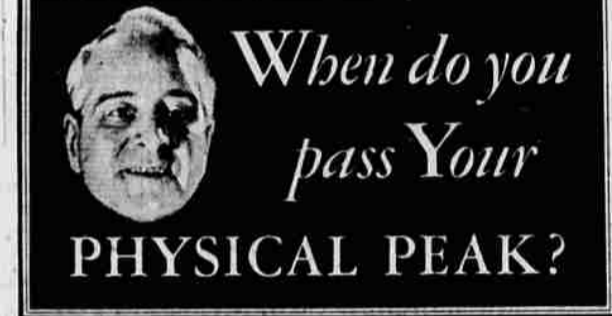
