WEEKEND TRADING SHOWS OPTIMISM; TURNOVER IS BIG

NEW YORK, July 25.—(P)—Motor cars, headed by Chrysler, led selected stock market issues on an upward push today. Gains of fractions to 3 or more points were plentiful and some new highs for the past several years were recorded. The close was firm. Transfers approximated 600,000 shares.

Buying sentiment was further stimulated by the generous Chrysler disbursement and record earnings. Chrysler opened at 120 1/4, a new peak since 1929. General Motors also was in the van.

Gulf States steel was a star performer, up around 5 at its best. Westinghouse was ahead 3 or so. Others conspicuous on the move included U. S. Steel, Sears Roebuck, Spiegel-May-Stern, Douglas Aircraft, Stone and Webster, Minneapolis - Honeywell, Fourth National Investor, Brooklyn and Queens Transit and Collins and Aikman.

In the lower divisions were J. I. Case, U. S. Smelting, Ulen and Co. and Deere.
