

Jack Lovelock Shaves World Record To Take Metric Mile From Cunningham

ITALIAN FAVORITE CROSSES LINE THIRD TRAILED BY ROMANI

OLYMPIC STADIUM, BERLIN, Aug. 6.—(UP)—Jack Lovelock, slender blond New Zealand medical student, set a world record as he raced to victory in the Olympic 1500-meter run today, defeating one of the greatest fields ever assembled on the same track.

Lovelock, pressed to the limit by the stars running against him, covered the distance in three minutes, 47.8 seconds, a second faster than the world record set by Bill Bonithron of Princeton on June 30, 1934, in Milwaukee.

The New Zealander broke the Olympic record of 3:51.2 set in 1932 by Luigi Beccali of Italy who finished third today. Glenn Cunningham of the United States was second, eight feet behind Lovelock.

Cunningham, who holds the world mile record, also shattered the 1500 mark as he came home in 3:48.4. Beccali Third

Beccali, the "Milan powerhouse," who had been favored to retain his title, bested the tape six feet behind Cunningham in one of the greatest "Olympic miles" in history. Archie San Romani of Kansas finished fourth. Phil Edwards, dusky Canadian star who was third in 1932, placed fifth and John (Jerry) Cornes of Great Britain, who was second to Beccali four years ago, was sixth.

Beccali, Romani and Edwards all bettered the Italian's Olympic mark. Beccali's time was 3:40.2; Romani, 3:50 and Edwards 3:50.4. Cornes' time was 3:50.1.

Towns Equals Record

Previous to Lovelock's triumph, Forrest (Spec) Towns of the University of Georgia had equaled the pending world record of himself and Roy Staley of Corona, Cal., in the 110-meter hurdles. Towns went the distance in 14.1 seconds in winning his first semi-final heat, shattering the Olympic mark of 14.4 set in 1932 by George Hailing of the United States in a qualifying heat. He also bettered the accepted world record of 14.2 set by Percy Beard of the United States made in Norway, on Aug. 6, 1934.

Moving along with Towns into the finals of the hurdles scheduled for later in the day was Frederick (Fritz) Pollard, son of the former Brown University negro football star. Staley, ironically, failed to qualify, finishing fourth in the first heat to John St. Ledger Thornton of Great Britain.

Three Stars Survive

America's three 400-meter speedsters survived opening and quarter-final tests of that event today. After qualifying with ease this morning, the three California runners—Archie Williams, Jimmy Luvalle and Harold Smallwood—this afternoon moved into tomorrow's semi-finals.

Luvalle won his heat in 47.6, the fastest time of the afternoon, while Smallwood finished second in the opening heat and Williams took the third heat. Smallwood led all the way and then fell back on purpose when he stopped to look around for opposition.

Early today, three American hop, step and jump stars and three javelin throwers qualified for the finals of those events.

The weather was overcast.

Cornes Takes Lead

Cornes, running smoothly went into the lead at the start with Beccali running second.

At the 300-meter mark—three laps from the finish—Werner Roettcher of Germany was out in front by two feet with Cornes running steadily behind him. Beccali was two feet back of Cornes and Fritz Schumacher of Germany two feet back of him. Next was Eric Ny of Sweden and in the last three places were Cunningham, Lovelock and Romani.

At the 700-meter mark Cunningham was on top by two feet. Ny was second and a half foot behind came Schumacher. Lovelock, running well within himself, was a foot behind the tall German with Beccali next and Roettcher after the Italian.

As they swung into the 900-meter mark it became apparent that the final battle would be between Lovelock, Beccali and Cunningham.

At the start of the bell lap—400 meters from the finish—Ny slammed into the lead as a mighty roar went up from the crowd of 95,000.

Cunningham Goes Ahead

Cunningham, with a short burst of speed, stole the lead away from Ny with Lovelock, Beccali and Edwards tagging at his heels. Gene Venzke, the former University of Pennsylvania star, was last.

Two hundred meters from home, Lovelock began the furious drive that rocketed him across the line in front—once more the ruling mile runner of the world.

Beccali and Cunningham tried to match the New Zealander's finish "kick" but were too spent. Heading into the final turn, 95,000 persons knew that Lovelock would win the classic event of the record-shattering Olympic games.

Powerful Finish

Lovelock finished powerfully, jogging halfway around the track again to a thunder of applause.

Track and field—
Jesse Owens completed his Olympic triple, winning 200-meter title in new world record time of 20.7 seconds; Mack Robinson, Pasadena, Cal., ran second.

Earl Meadows captured pole vault, boosting Olympic record to 4.35 meters, 14 feet, 2 1/2 inches; Bill Sefton, finished fourth and Bill Graber fifth.

Discus championship went to Ken Carpenter with new Olympic record toss of 50.55 meters; Gordon Dunn placed second; Walter Wood failed to qualify for finals.

Harold Whitlock, Great Britain, clipped nearly 20 minutes off Olympic standard in winning the 50,000 meter walk in four hours, 30 minutes, 41.4 seconds.

All three American girls in women's 50 meter hurdles—Simone Schaller, Anne Vrana O'Brien and Tyde Pickett, were eliminated as Trebelsoda Valla, Italy, equaled world's record of 11.6 seconds and clipped one-tenth off Olympic standard.

Seattle lost more ground to the second place Portland team, dropping a 4-1 decision to the San Diego Padres while the Beavers were dividing a doubleheader with the Missions.

Howard Craghead, ace Padre moundman, stopped the league-leading Indians short with two hits to turn in one of the best pitching performances of the season.

His teammates touched Dick Barrett for ten hits and scored in the fifth, sixth and seventh.

Portland got the best of a tight argument in the first double bill game, winning 3-2 after the Missions staged a two-run rally in the ninth inning that threatened the Beaver lead. Both teams hit eight times.

The Reds came back in the second encounter to win 5-2 after the teams broke even again in the hitting column, each getting six. The Missions did their heavy scoring in the second inning, pushing over three runs.

Los Angeles and Sacramento also split a doubleheader. The Solons blanked the Angels 4-0 in the first tilt, booming out to an early lead with three tallies in the first inning.
