

Local Produce Markets Very Active; Wall Street Sees Another Gain

WHEAT DROPS TO 92 CENTS; GREEN PEPPERS LOWERED

Grain prices were slightly lower and a few cuts in prices on vegetables were reported as the main changes in local markets, Saturday.

Wheat is down to 92 cents here. All other grains continued unchanged.

In the vegetable list, green peppers tumbled to 5 cents a pound, local gardens sending in larger supplies now.

Local grown tomatoes are slightly weaker, too.

All produce—eggs, poultry, butter and butterfat—remained unchanged, Saturday.

Portland Produce Prices Improving

PORTLAND, Aug. 8.—(P)—Despite the competition of prior sales of low priced cantaloupes by some of the wholesalers receiving consignments, there was a further improvement in demand during the Saturday session of the East Side Farmers' wholesale market. Cantaloupes sold generally at 75c crate for both The Dalles and Yakimas with call very good.

Tomatoes likewise acted better with average sales 50c box for best stuff although some fractional business was shown 45-55c.

There were further efforts to depress cabbage but sales were again generally made \$1.75 crate.

Celery hearts were fairly steady at 95c to \$1 dozen bunches generally.

Spinach sold 60-75c orange box.

Northern cauliflower was \$1.25 crate.

Dalles early Crawford peaches sold 75c box for best with early local stock around 60-75c box.

Beans were mostly sold 4c lb.

Corn sales were 50-75c crate or sack.

Lettuce sold \$1.35-1.75 crate.

Eggplant was around 50c flat.

Peppers held mostly 40c box.

Lima beans in the shell were 75c box.

Crabapples were 40c small box.

Pickling cucumbers sold 20-25c box according to size. Slicing at 30-40c box.

Strawberries sold \$2-2.25 crate.

Raspberries were nominally \$1.75 crate.

Loganberries sold \$1.00 crate with a nominal offering.

Blackberries were also in limited offering at \$1.

Youngberries sold \$1.00-2 crate.

Potatoes sold \$1.25 orange box generally for good stuff, a few \$1.50.

SATURDAY BUSY DAY FOR MARKET

Saturday was an exceptionally busy day for the Producers Public market, a large crowd turning out to shop among the fine displays of local produce.

Tomatoes and green peppers were both cut to 5 cents a pound, retail, Saturday.

Most of the other market quotations were steady for the day. Good corn is still coming in, although the season is getting well along. Gravenstein apples are coming in more plentifully. Green beans continue plentiful, too.

"OLD RELIABLES" LEAD IN WEEKEND TRADING ADVANCE

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—(P)—Gains of fractions to more than 2 points were widely scattered through the stock market in the final minutes of a rather busy week-end session today.

Chart-readers found a bullish technical signal in the rise of leading Italian shares to new peaks for the year, among them New York Central, Southern Pacific, Union Pacific and Santa Fe. The leadership of these rails and old-time industrialists like General Electric and Westinghouse Electric, both of which sold at new highs, was considered impressive in some commission house quarters.

Allied Chemical expanded its gains sharply. Leading Copper shares traded around best prices of the year as firm export quotations for the metal were taken as indication of good foreign demand, partly traceable to war preparations.

Strong spots included Western Union, Gulf States Steel, United States Steel, North American, Johns Manville and Sears Roebuck.
