# Coyotes Increasing Biologists Believe

MEACHAM, Ore., Aug. 13.—(AP)—This little Blue Mountain town in eastern Oregon, usually on winter weather tables as one of the west's cold spots, ignored such mundane things as thermometer readings today. Instead the topic was coyotes and the problems of birth control.

"Coyotes are getting fat since sheep came into this country, and the well-fed females are becoming more fertile," W. M. Rush of the U. S. biological survey said. "Formerly coyotes delivered litters of four to five pups, but we know of one coyote which recently gave birth to 17 and two others which brought 14 hungry pups each."

# Old Days Recalled By Filing On Land Near Cottage Grove

A patent to 40 acres of land west of Cottage Grove and issued at the Roseburg land office Dec. 20, 1872, was filed for record in the office of County Clerk Walter B. Dillard Thursday to complete the record on an abstract of title to this land.

The patent was given to N. Martin, a pioneer of Lane county. It conveyed this 40 acres, lying in section 23, township 29 south of range 4 west, from the government to Mr. Martin. While the land in question has changed hands several times since, the abstract has been incomplete because the patent was never recorded. It is now owned by M. F. Babcock and a part of it is being sold.
