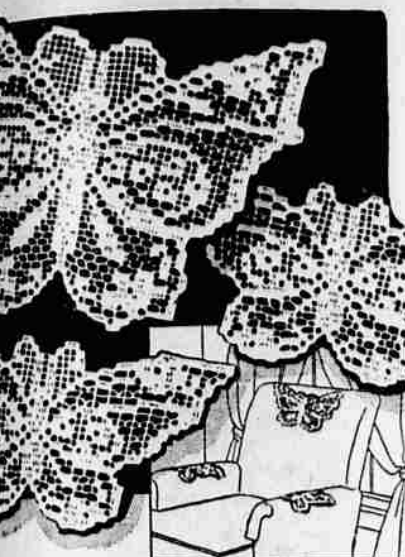


BUTTERFLY CROCHET DRESSES UP CHAIR SAYS LAURA WHEELER

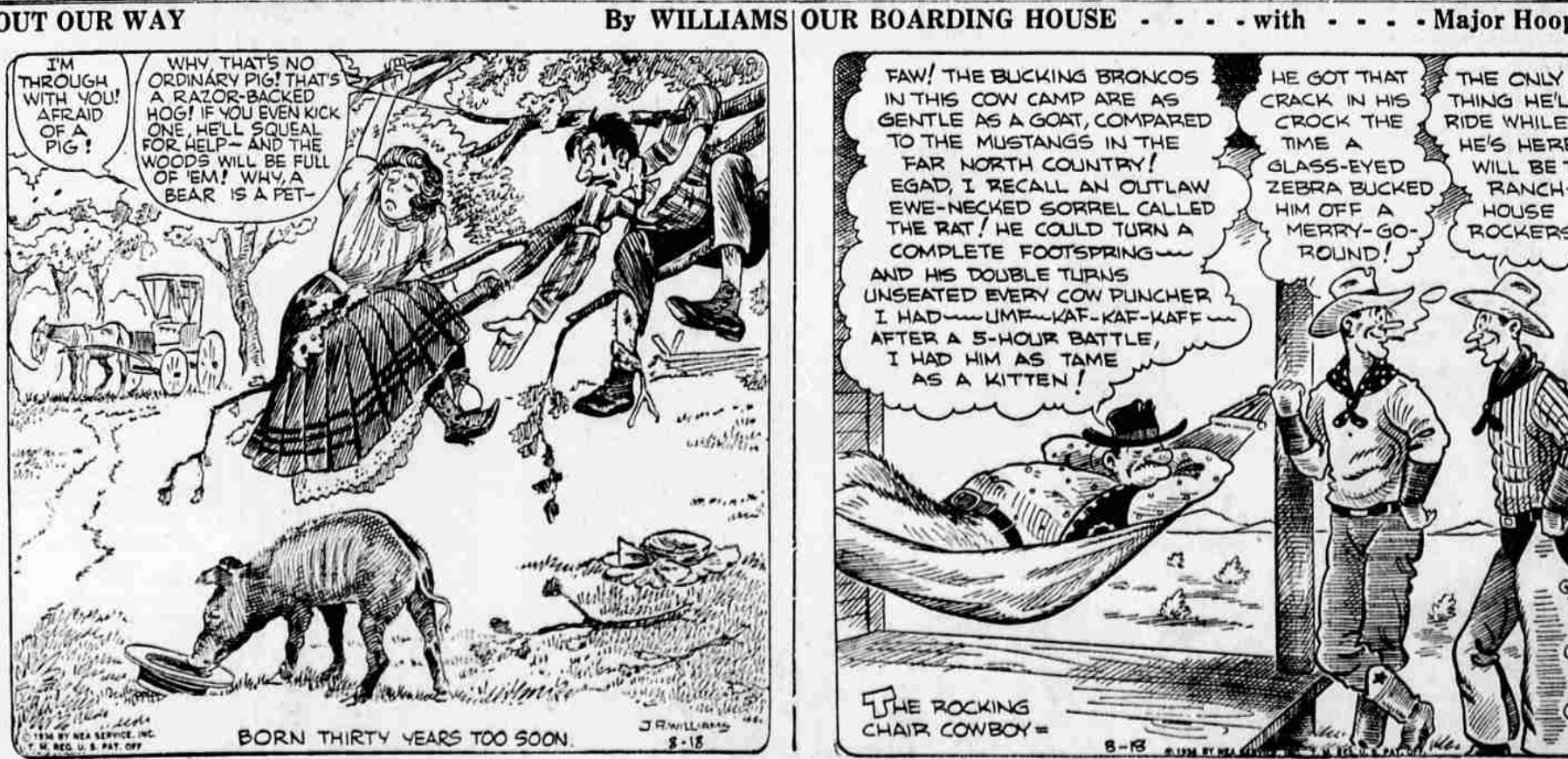
