EAGER TO RETURN TO GERMANY

THE zealous Nazi spirit that has brought the Saar back to Germany and has left its mark on Danzig is spreading to the former colonies of the Fatherland. In 1915 British Colonials walked in to German Southwest Africa and took command there. After the war, that territory was mandated to the Union of South Africa.

Now reports have it that trained Nazi propagandists have entered the old German colony and stirred up the 15,000 German natives there, despite a League of Nations decree against such activity. Tension has run high between German and British inhabitants, and the Union of South Africa has set up a commission to investigate the situation. Fear is expressed that this may be the first colony to demand its return to Germany.

Perhaps this territory, like the Saar and even
