FEARSOME JUDICIAL SYSTEM IS SET UP IN SPANISH TOWNS

MADRID, (AP)—A fearsome revolutionary judicial system has been inaugurated and is working night and day to clear a calendar of 3,000 cases against persons suspected of treason, it was disclosed today.

The courts were set up in answer to demands of left wing elements for swift action against rebels. They are working in Madrid, in Barcelona and in Malaga. The first day's total of known dispositions was:

Madrid—Five army officers sentenced to death and summarily executed; one sentenced to life imprisonment, four to 20 years' imprisonment.

Barcelona—Four officers sentenced to death; 24 awaiting trial. Malaga—Eleven navy officers sentenced to death.

Hundreds await immediate trial here, and any of the 3,000 persons under arrest in ordinary jails and the convents which have been converted into prisons may face the dread court.

The new judicial system represents a definite effort to return Madrid to more of a semblance of normal life than has obtained since the revolution started.

By official decree the courts will have full jurisdiction over charges of rebellion, sedition and other crimes against the state. That the set up is to be a national one is indicated by the statement that headquarters will be at Madrid.

with Mariano Gomez, chief justice of the supreme court, presiding over the central court.

Announcement of the new system coincided with an increase in the number of official searches and arrests. It was announced a secret rebel radio station had been unearthed and at Barcelona search of the home of a millionaire rebel sympathizer disclosed more than \$1,000,000 in cash and jewels.
